DEFINITION

Home improvement is work that you do to your house to make it better and more attractive.

LANGUAGE POINTS

If you don't have the skill or experience to fix or improve something in your home, you need to arrange for a professional to do it for you. Study the structures below.

- 1. We use the structure "have something done" when arranging for somebody to do something for us:
- Example 1: The walls were very dirty so I had them painted.
- Example 2: My washing machine is working again. I managed to have it fixed.
- 2. In informal English, we can also use <u>get</u> instead of <u>have</u>. Example: The walls were very dirty so I <u>got</u> them <u>painted</u>.
