PART 1 DISTRACTORS

A. Similar-sounding words

As you listen to the four choices, pay close attention to similar-sounding words with different meanings.

(e.g. She's setting the table. Vs. She's sitting at the table.)

B. Wrong word usage

This type of distractor asks you to identify the correct word. It is a vocabulary item. (e.g. She's setting the table. She's buying the table. She's wiping the table. She's waxing the table.)
