- Indirect Response: "I have no idea."
- <u>Twisted Response:</u> "Actually, I think it's John's."

"How about going out for dinner tonight?"

- O <u>Direct Response:</u> "Good idea!"
- Indirect Response: "Let me think about it."
- O <u>Counter Attack Response:</u> "What restaurant do you have in mind?"

"Would you mind helping me look for my camera?"

- O **Direct Response:** "Not at all."
- Indirect Response: "Sorry. The manager just called me."
- O <u>Counter Attack Response</u>: "What kind is it?"
