Personal Pronouns

Personal pronouns are used when it is clear who or what is being talked about. *E.g. Mike is my best friend.* **He** is a teacher.

Subject pronouns: we use subject pronouns as the subject of the clause.

Object pronouns: we use the object pronouns in all positions apart from subject,

e.g. after the verb, or after a preposition.

Possessive pronouns *indicate ownership.* (e.g. That car is **hers.** It is **mine.**)

If a pronoun is used to indicate to whom an object belongs --- it is called a **possessive adjective** (e.g. That is **her** car.)
