Aya: You're right. Their son is my friend.

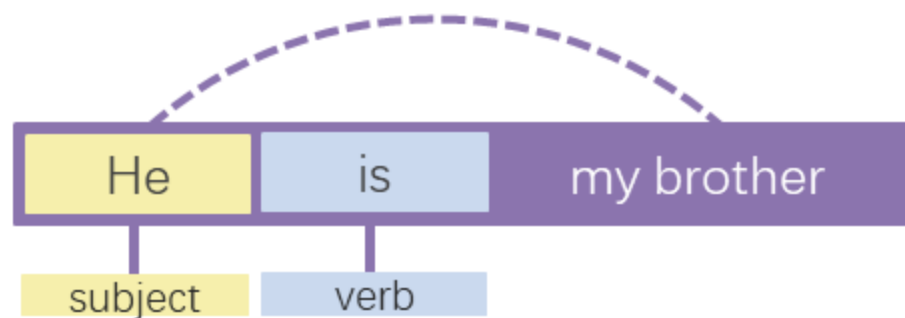
Bo: I see.



Learn the sentence structure: linking verbs - am, is, are.

Linking verbs: am, is, are

A linking verb connects a subject with a word that describes or identifies it.



I	am
---	----

You	are
-----	-----

He	is
She	

We	are
They	

S: He **is** my brother.

Q: **Is** he your brother?

A: Yes, he is.

No, he isn't.

Subject Pronouns and Possessive Adjectives

Subject pronouns + be verbs

Examples:

They are our neighbors.

He is Hiro.

Yes/No question-and-answer form:

Q: Are **they** your neighbors?

A: Yes, they are.

No, they aren't.

Possessive adjectives + nouns

Examples:

He is **my** brother.

They are **our** parents.

Yes/No question-and-answer form:

Q: Is he **your** brother?

A: Yes, he is.

No, he isn't.

	Subject Pronouns	Possessive Adjectives
Singular (1 person)	I	my
	you	your
	he	his
	she	her
	it	its
Plural (2 or more people)	we	our
	they	their
