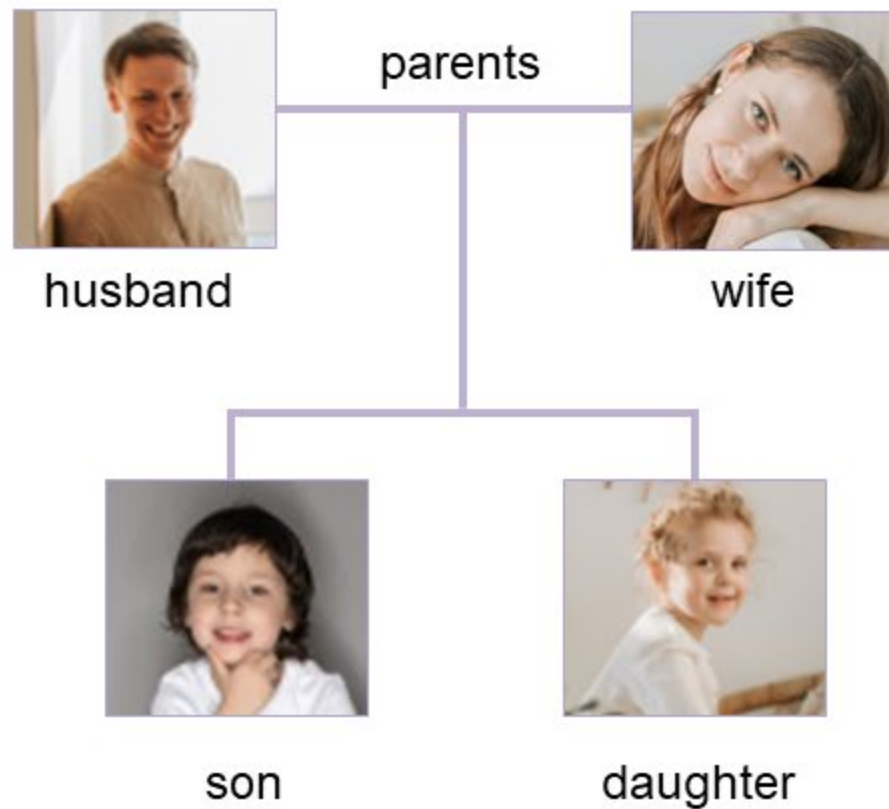
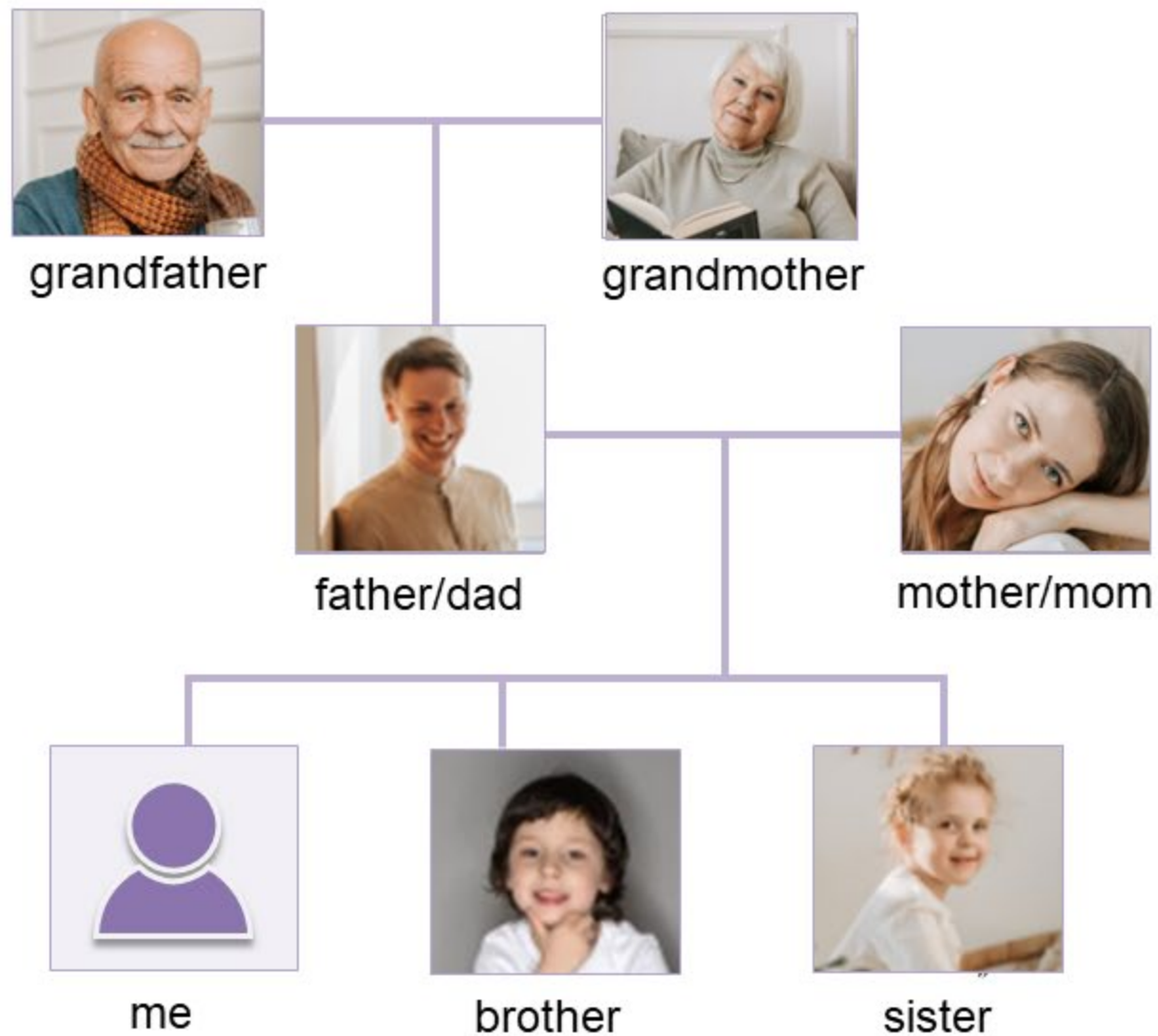
Today's Sentences

2 Main Uses of the Apostrophe (')

Apostrophes

1. We add an **Apostrophe S ('s)** for the possessive form of singular nouns. For plural nouns or names that end with an "s", we only add an **apostrophe (')**.

| name of her father | her father's name |
| brother of Anna | Anna's brother |
| book of Thomas | Thomas' book |
| office of the doctors | doctors' office |

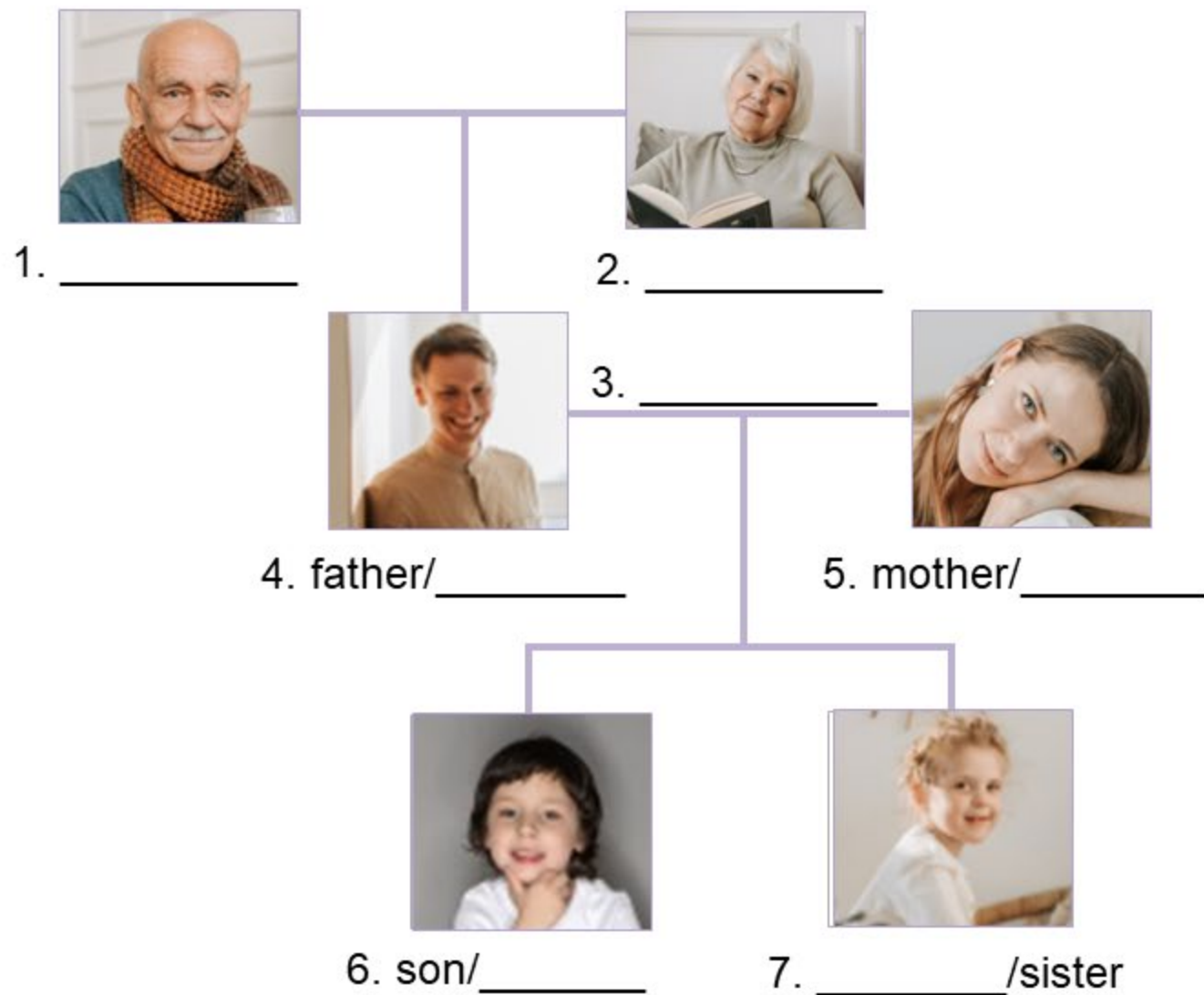
- ✗ She's grandfather name is Joe.

2. We use an **Apostrophe (')** for contractions.
