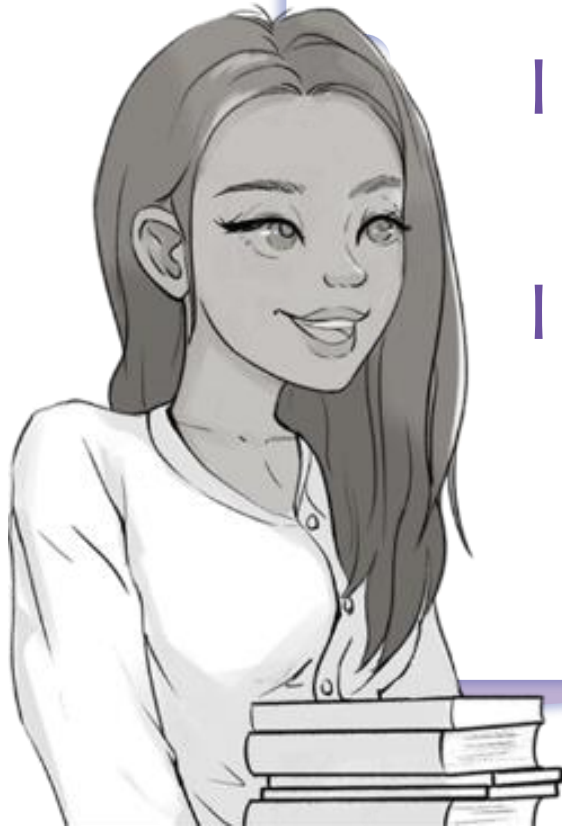

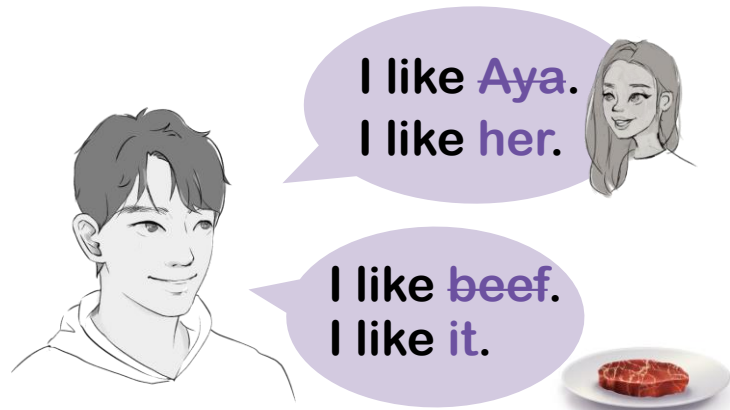

2 nd Person	you	you
3 rd Person	him/her/it	them
