



Countable and Uncountabe Nouns

Countable Nouns

can be counted

Ex: egg, apple, carrot, vegetable, burger, etc.

have a Singular and Plural form

one egg, two eggs, three eggs, etc.
one carrot, two carrots, three carrots, etc.
one book, two books, three books, etc.

Can be used with "a/an" and "some"



I need **one** apple. I need **an** apple.

Countable and Uncountabe Nouns

Uncountable Nouns

cannot be counted

Ex: meat, flour, milk, butter, bread, etc.

always in Singular form

X one meat

✓ meat

x two flours

✓ flour

x three butters

✓ butter
