Bo: Would you like to go with me?

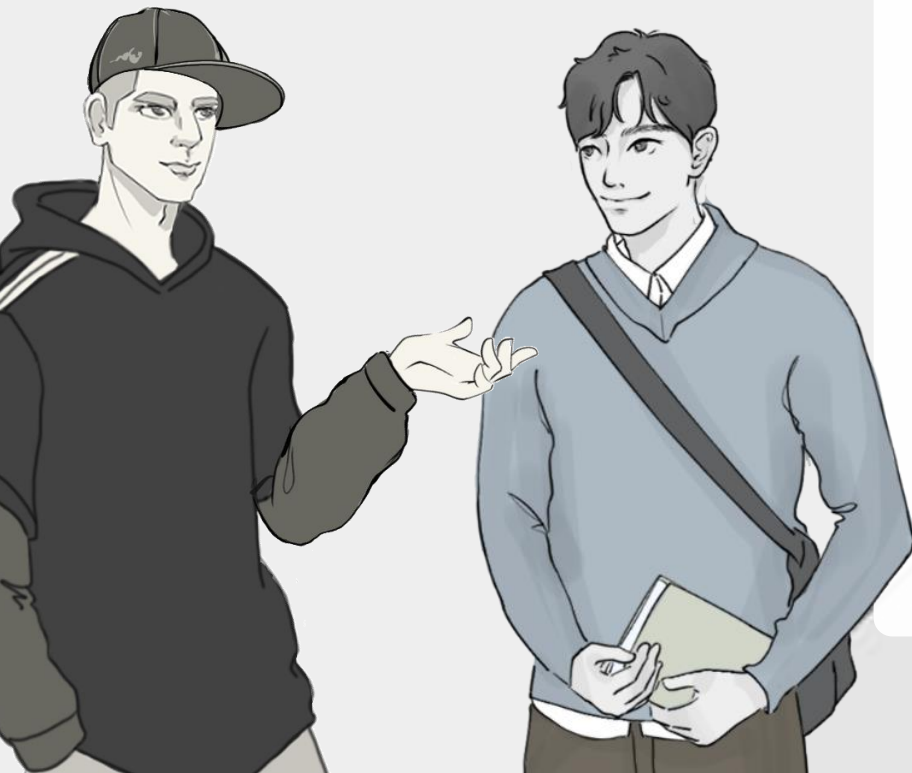
Rio: Why not?

Adverbs of Frequency

100%	always	She always arrives at 7:30 a.m. She is always hungry.
90%	usually	He usually walks the dog after dinner. The shop is usually open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
70%	often	They often spend Christmas in Hawaii. Mrs. and Mr. Beckon are often arguing about kids.
30%	sometimes	Jackson sometimes writes to me. This watch is sometimes fast and sometimes slow.
0%	never	The sun never rises in the west. I have never been to Thailand.
