

What + noun + can

"What" functions as an adjective modifying the noun that follows, thus making the question more specific.

What + noun + can?		
Statement	Question	
Anna can play volleyball.	What sport can Anna play?	
She can speak Thai and Spanish.	What languages can she speak?	
He can play the trumpet.	What musical instrument can he play?	



It is used to help someone or to do something for someone.

- Subject + Auxiliary Verb Can +Main Verb ...
 - Don't worry. I can help you.
 - I can check the school website for you.

Be able to

ability on one occasion

Could and Be able to are used to express ability.

Present: can

e.g. We can speak English.

Past: could

e.g. She could paint well before.

Future: (no future form)

Present: am/is/are able to

e.g. We are able to complete the task.

Past: was/were able to

e.g. She was able to steal the purse.

Future: will be able to

e.g. You will be able to drive soon.


