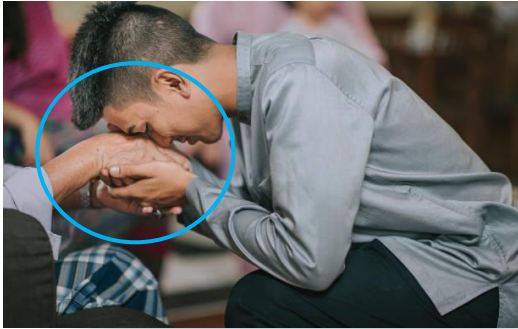

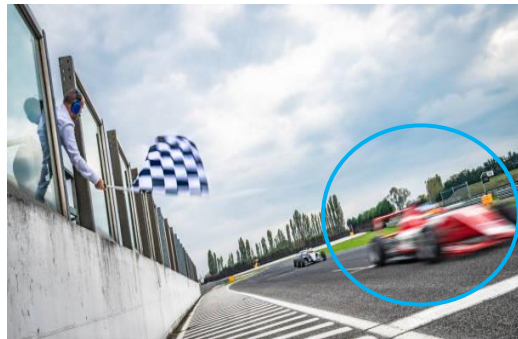

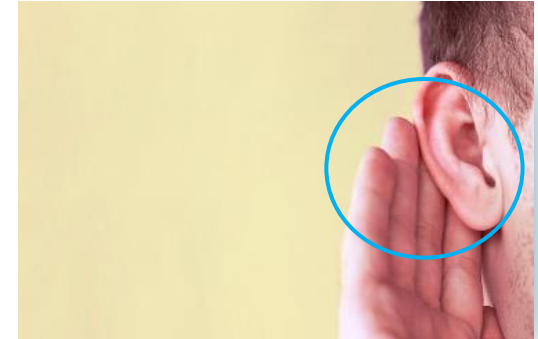

ADVERBS OF MANNER

Verbs

Adverbs describe the way an action is happening.

Adjectives

Adverbs add a degree of intensity to the adjective.

Other adverbs

Adverbs make sentences clumsy, so use them sparingly.

Sentences

Adverbs express a general opinion about the information in the sentence.

Bo sings **loudly** in the shower.

My dog waits **patiently** for his food.

The painting is **quite** beautiful.

The story was **very** interesting.

Robin is speaking **very** rudely.


Please work **very** diligently.

Fortunately, we arrived on time.

Honestly, most television comedies are excruciatingly vulgar.

Rules when forming adverbs of manner from adjectives

1 For most adjectives, we simply add -ly.

e.g. accurate - accurately

2 Ending in -y, changed into i then add -ly

e.g. easy - easily

3 Irregular adverbs retain as adjectives.

e.g. fast - fast



Else & Also

We use “else” to mean another or extra in questions while we use “also” to mean in addition in answers.

➤ Wh-question + else + can + subject ...?

What can you play?

– *I can play basketball.*

What else can you play?

– *I can also play baseball.*

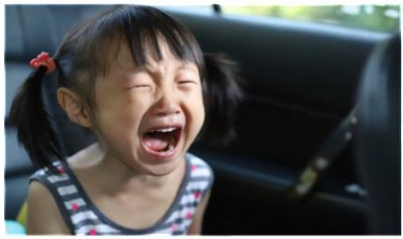
