

# **Comparative Adverbs**

- to make comparisons between two verbs;

- describes how, when, how often, or to what degree an action is done.

#### First Rule

with adverbs ending in -ly, you must use 'more' to form the comparative

#### more slowly

more quietly

The teacher spoke *more slowly* to help us to understand.

Could you sing *more quietly* please?

#### **Second Rule**

with short adverbs that do not end in -ly: add '-er' to form the comparative

#### harder

faster

Jim works *harder than* his brother.

Freya speaks *faster than* Trisha.

#### **Third Rule**

some adverbs have irregular comparative

#### farther

worse

The little boy ran *farther than* his friends.




