General Future Tense: “Will”



‘will’ is used to talk about future actions.

Prediction

It is used when we make a prediction that is only a guess or an opinion.

It will rain tomorrow.

She will become a teacher someday.

We will drive flying cars in the future.

Spontaneous decision

It is used to express unplanned future decisions.

I will pay by credit card.

The phone is ringing. I will answer it.

I will take a kilo of apples, please.

Modal “Will”: Interrogative

Will / Won't + subject (*singular and plural*) + base form of the verb + time expression?

	Subject (Singular or Plural)	base form of the verb	time expression
Will	I / We	rain	tomorrow
Won't (Will not)	You He / She / It / They	become pay	someday In the future

Will it rain tomorrow?

Will she become a teacher someday?

Will you pay by credit card?

Won't she answer the phone?

Can you make more *interrogative sentences* using 'will / won't'?

Affirmative and Negative Answer

Yes/No, subject (*singular and plural*) + will/won't + base form of the verb + time expression.

+

AFFIRMATIVE

Will ___ attend the party tonight?

- Yes, I will attend the party tonight.
Yes, we will attend the party tonight.
- Yes, he/ she will attend the party tonight.
Yes, they will attend the party tonight.

-

NEGATIVE

Will ___ take her home after work?

- No, I won't take her home after work.
No, we won't take her home after work.
- No, he/ she won't take her home after work.
No, they won't take her home after work.
