used to talk about completed actions in a time before now

action ended in the past

I made my résumé last week.

He broke his tooth yesterday.

series of completed actions in the past

He prepared the food, sat down, and ate dinner.

He got out of bed, took a bath, and brushed his teeth.

habits in the past

Sean played the piano when he was a child.

They studied Spanish when they were students.

Rules	Present	Past
Add the letters -ed	answer	answered
A verb that ends in -e + d	announce	announced
A verb with a short vowel ending in a consonant; double the consonant + -ed	step	stepped
A verb that ends in -y; change the y into i and + -ed	hurry	hurried



Change a vowel "o" to a vowel "e"	know	knew
Change "y" to "id"	pay	paid
Change a double vowel to a single vowel	choose	chose
Change "eep" to "ept"	sleep	slept
Some verbs do not change their forms	cut	cut
Some verbs change completely	teach	taught
