Imperatives

are used to give commands and orders

We use the **base form** with **no subject**.

✗ **You** open the window.

✓ **Open** the window.

Positive:

Come to my desk when your shift ends.

Bring your laptops tomorrow.

Please **do** the laundry in the afternoon.

Negative:

Don't push your classmates.

Don't play with the ball in the classroom.


Please **don't run** in the corridor.

"Please"

To make imperatives more polite, add "**please**" at the **beginning** or **end** of the sentence.

- **Please** drive slowly.
- Drive slowly, **please**.

- **Please** don't smoke here.
- Don't smoke here, **please**.



Learn the different uses of Imperatives.

Other uses of imperatives:

- **Giving a warning or prohibition**

Watch out for falling objects!
Please don't touch me!

- **Giving instructions**

Go straight ahead then turn left.
Take the pill after a meal.

- **Giving advice**

Don't panic and stay calm.
Don't eat too much.

- **Giving a request**

Please pass the bowl.
Leave me alone, please.

“let’s” is for Suggestions

We use **let’s** to suggest doing something.

Let’s + (not) + **base form verb**

Positive:

Let’s go to the theatre.

Let’s sing karaoke on the weekend.

Let’s take a short break.

Negative:

Let’s not be lazy today.

Let’s not swim.

Let’s not go to work for now.

Note:

- Let + us = **Let’s**
- Do not forget to put an **apostrophe**.
- ✗ **Lets** go to the cinema.
- ✓ **Let’s** go to the cinema.

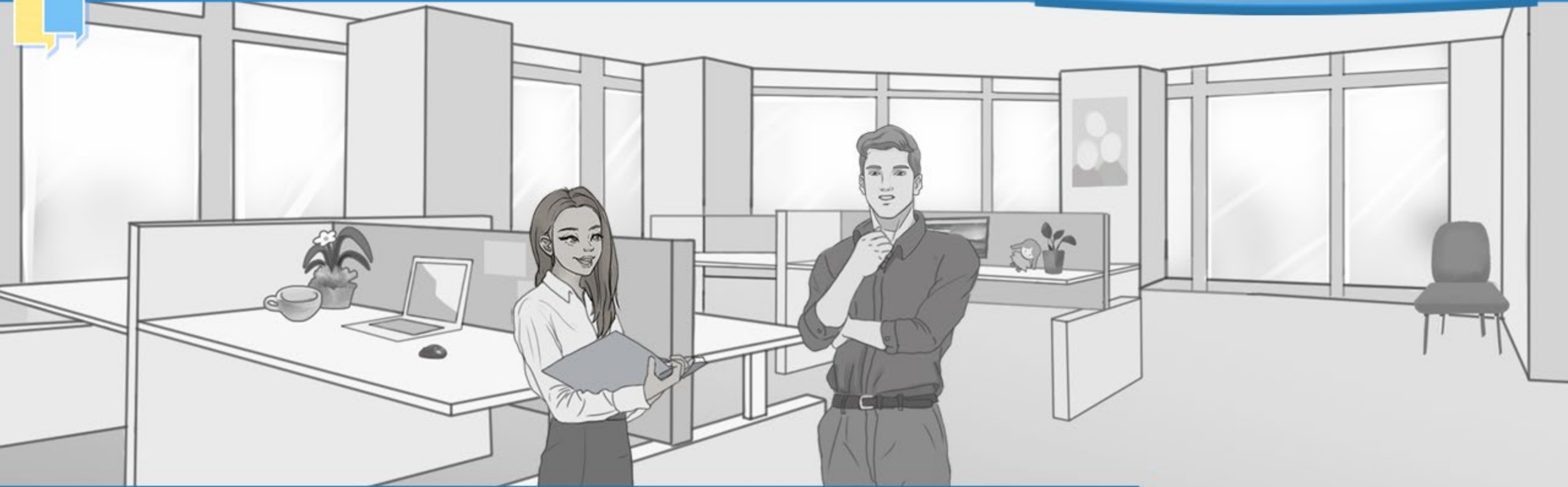
