Progressive Verb Tenses

- is used to refer to an action or a state that is continuous
- also called as **Continuous Tenses**.

Present Progressive Tense

am/is/are + verb-ing

Past Progressive Tense

was/were + verb-ing

Future Progressive Tense

will be + verb-ing



Review the grammar structures.



Present Progressive Tense

is used to talk about actions that is in progress now

am/is/are + running/not running

- +** He **is running** to school.
- He **is not running** to school.
- ?** **Is** he **running** to school?
--- Yes, he is. / No, he isn't.

other examples:

I **am reading** my favorite book.

They **aren't playing** cards.

Are they **washing** the dishes?

 Review the grammar structures. **Past Progressive Tense**

is used to talk about actions that was in progress in the past

was/were + writing/not writing

- +** She **was writing** a letter.
- She **was not writing** a letter.
- ?** **Was** she **writing** a letter?
--- Yes, she was. / No, she wasn't.

other examples:They **were taking** a bath.We **weren't climbing** the mountain.**Were** they **eating** pizza?**Past****was****were**

Review the grammar structures.



Future Progressive Tense

is used to talk about actions that will be in progress

will be + writing/not writing

- +** I **will be baking** some cookies.
- I **will not be baking** some cookies.
- ?** **Will I be baking** some cookies?
--- Yes, I will. / No, I won't.

other examples:

She **will be singing** a song tomorrow.

We **won't be going** to the cinema.

Will he be cooking dinner tonight?
