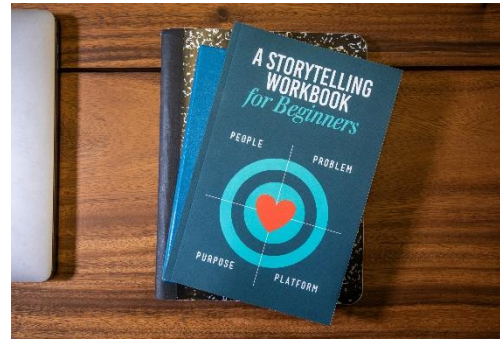

Present Perfect: Recent Past

We use the Present Perfect when the past situation is very recent, meaning “a short time ago”.

We can use adverbs like **just**, **recently**, or **already**.

- **Just**

Jason **has just gotten up** from a long sleep.

I **have just finished** the meeting with Mr. Reeves.

- **Recently**

Laura **has joined** the dance club **recently**.

They **have recently opened** a business.

- **Already**

Sorry, I **have already eaten** the cake.

She **has washed** the dishes **already**.

Just

- immediately before the statement was made
- “just” is more recent than “recently”

Recently

- a short time ago

Already

- when something happened earlier than we expected

Present Perfect: Persistent Situation

We use the Present Perfect to describe a situation that started in the past but persists until the present.

We often use **for** and **since** for persistent actions.

- **For + length of time**

I have known him **for 2 years**.

He has worked in New York **for a long time**.

- **Since + point in time**

We've been friends **since 2019**.

He has worked in New York **since he left school**.

✗ She has been on the phone **since 6 hours**.

✗ She has been on the phone **for 6:15 p.m.**
