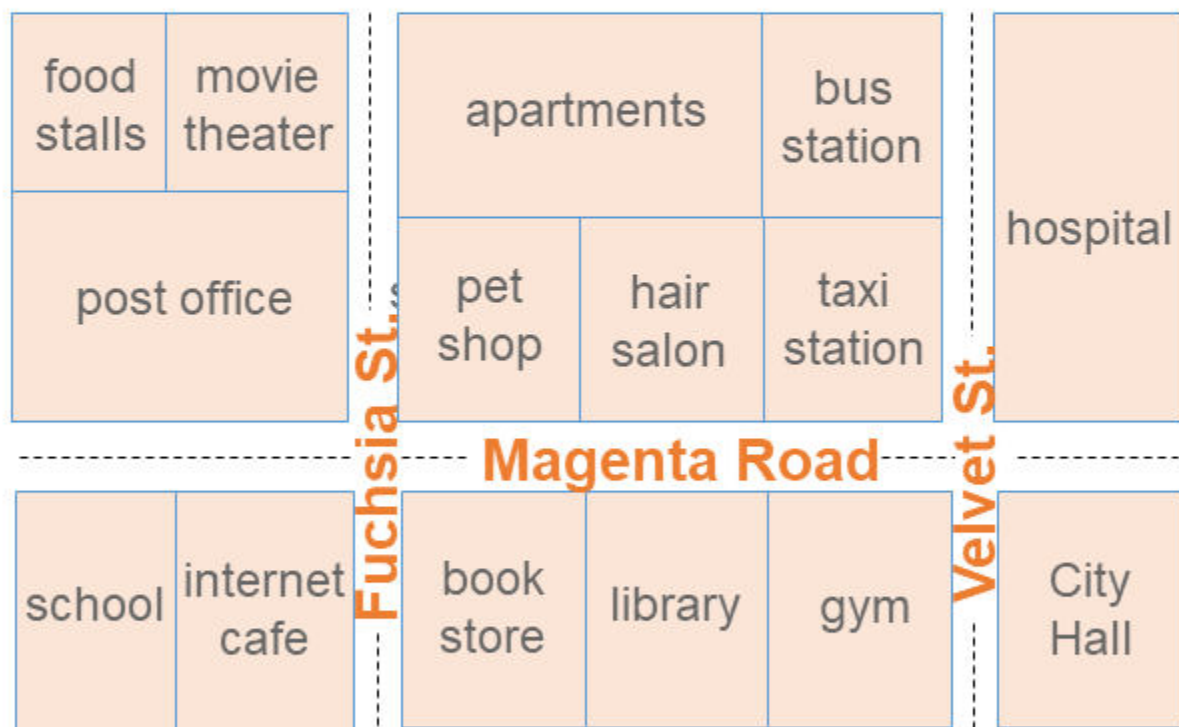

Invitations – Modal: Would

Giving an Invitation

- **Would** you like to grab some drinks?
- **Would** you like me to help you?
- **Would** you like some coffee?

Accept an Invitation

- That **would** be nice.
- Sure, that **would** be great!
- Yes, we **would** like to.

Reject an Invitation

- I **would** like to but...
- Unfortunately, I **wouldn't** be able to come.

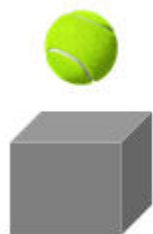
“**Would**” can also be used to propose a change of plan/preference:

- **Would** it be okay to come on Saturday instead?
- **Would** you be fine at the weekend instead?
- I **would** prefer pasta over rice, if that's okay with you.

- over, along, by, past, up, around



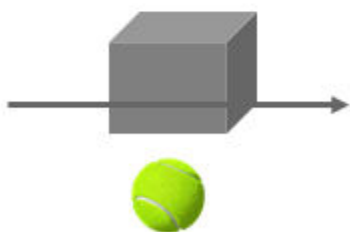
The ball is

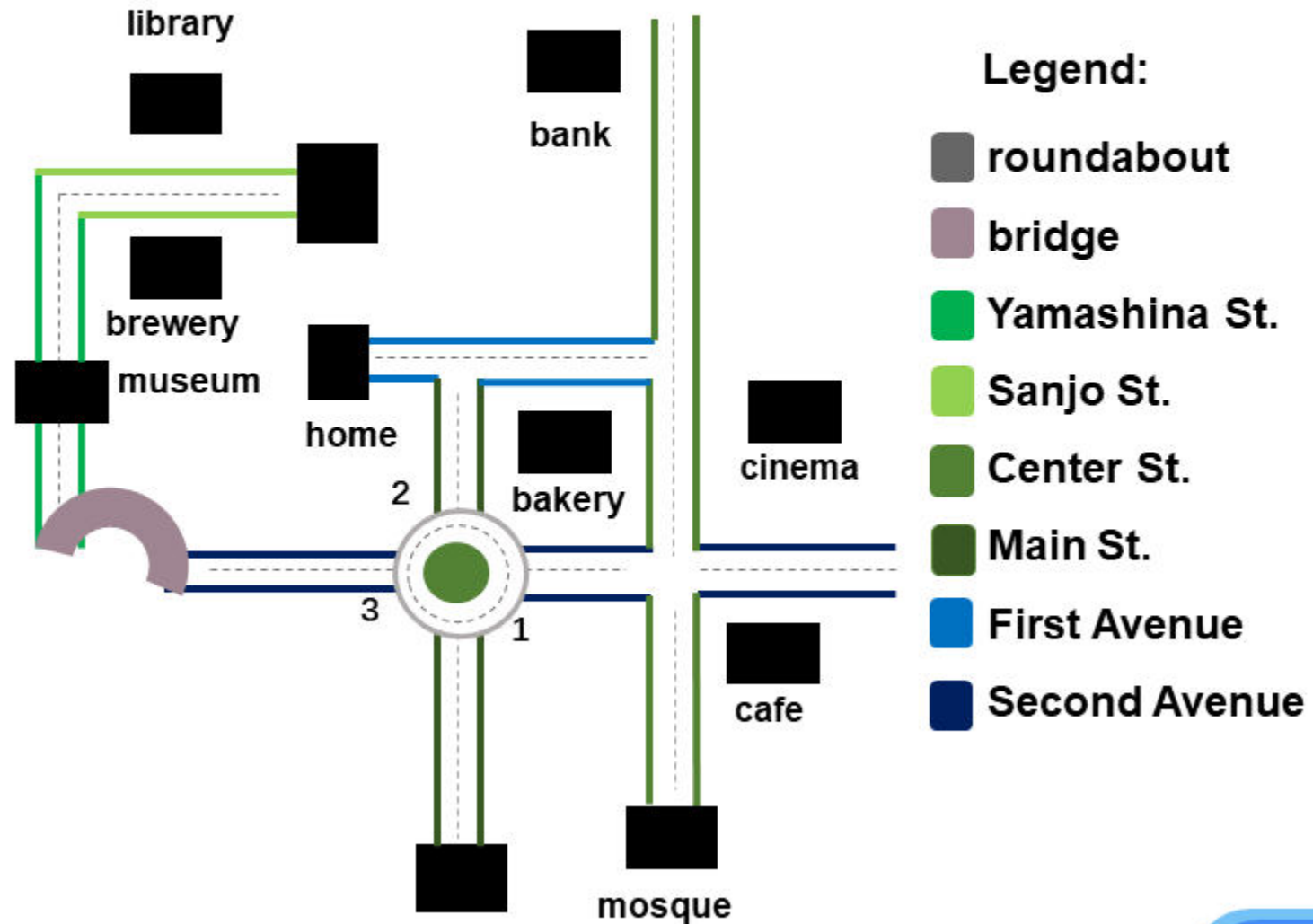
