Countable

A large number of people are watching.

There <u>are</u> **several** buildings in my city.

Dozens of rooms <u>have</u> been repainted.

Most books were bought from the shop.

I can eat only a small quantity of candies.

Uncountable

I have a large amount of work to do today.

My aunt has a great deal of money in the bank.

He knows a bit of information about the project.

Most furniture in the office is brand new.

A large quantity of water is needed for the trees to grow fast.

Collective Nouns

a type of noun that expresses a name of a collection of a bunch of several people, objects, things, animals, etc.

Structure Rules:

- Use a singular verb with a collective noun acting as a single unit.
- Use a plural verb when the individual members of the group are acting individually.

Examples:

The **class listens** to their teacher carefully.

The class answer their assignments on their own.

The **committee** is having a meeting right now.

The committee are allowed to leave the meeting soon.
