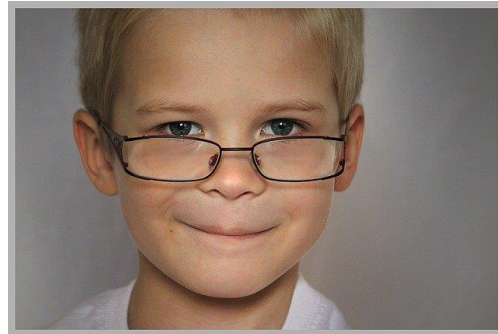

**Bo:** I just had a call with Mr. Tanaka this morning. **He said that he had checked the report you submitted to him last night** and we would have a meeting regarding last month's sales.

**Miku:** What about it? Is there something wrong?

**Bo:** He compared the number of sales per month we had this year and said that last month did not reach its target sales. We will probably have more work to do this month to compensate.

**Miku:** Is that right? **I wish I had worked harder**, but it can't be helped if no one is interested in buying our products.

**Bo:** Don't feel so disappointed. Cheer up. I'm sure Mr. Tanaka had already worked out a solution to the problem.

**Miku:** You are right. He is one of the cleverest people I know. Let's give the boss our full cooperation to fix this issue.

## Usage 3

to repeat what someone said using a **reported speech**.

**Mr. Daisuke:** I **checked** the report you submitted.

Mr. Daisuke **said** (that) **he had checked** the report you submitted.

**Keshi:** I **slept** at my friend's place last weekend.

Keshi **said** (that) he **had slept** at his friend's place last weekend.

**Paul:** Did Lucas **bring** anything to eat?

Paul **asked** if Lucas **had brought** anything to eat.

- After “**said**”, you may or may not use the word “**that**”.
- With “**asked**”, we use “**if**” before the noun or pronoun.

### Indirect Reported Speech

- We can repeat someone's statement by **going one step back in the past**.

**“I travel a lot.”**

She said that she **travelled** a lot.

**“I travelled a lot.”**

She said that she **had travelled** a lot.

- In indirect reported speech, we can repeat someone's statement by going one step back in the past.

## Usage 4

for unreal or imaginary things; wishes the past had been different

### I wish + noun/pronoun + had

A **preposition/conjunction** followed by a **clause** can be used to be specific.

I wish I **had studied** harder **before** I **graduated**.

Use “**instead of**” to express a more preferred action or event over what really happened.

I wish I **had studied** harder **instead of** playing games.

The **preposition/conjunction** and the **clause** that follows can also be omitted.

I wish I **had studied** harder. ~~before I graduated.~~

The **result** may be added in the next sentence.

I wish I **had not eaten** too much.  
**Now my stomach feels bad.**

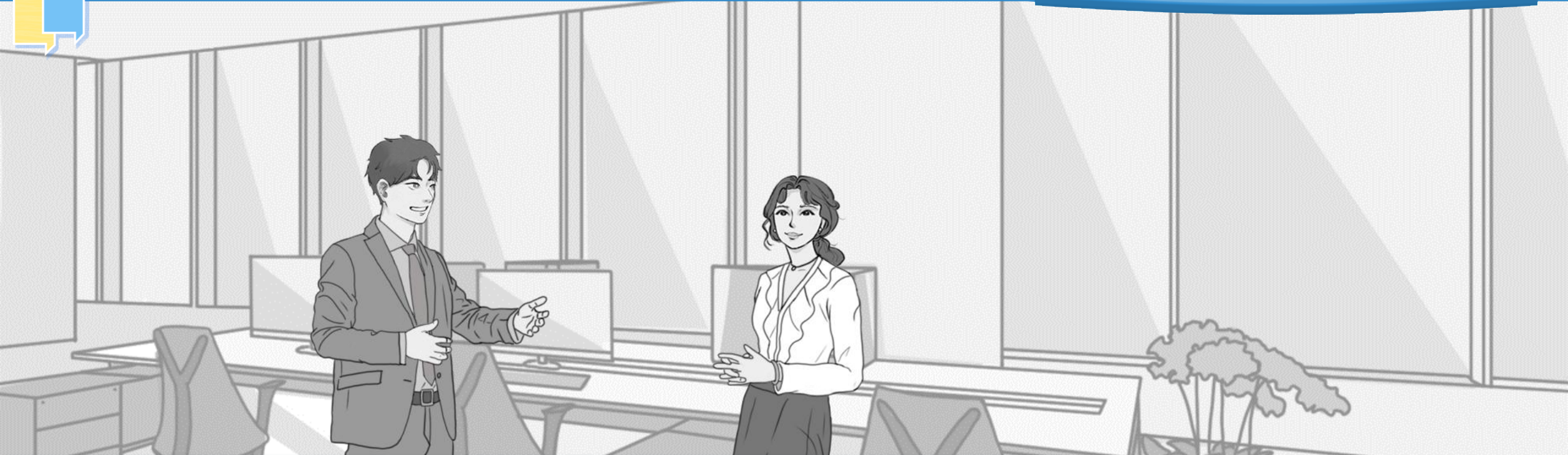
