He was shocked as he saw Aya had been sleeping during work hours. Steve was a bit annoyed at this. He wanted to wake her up, but she had been snoring a lot. On the way back to his office, he met Olivia on the stairs. He asked Olivia to wake Aya up.

Olivia knew that Aya slept like a rock. She had been thinking of ways to wake Aya. Suddenly, Olivia had a brilliant idea. She got a cup and filled it with water. Just as Olivia was about to pour water, Aya suddenly woke up. She had been having a nightmare about getting a job suspension. Aya stood up surprisingly and thanked Olivia. She immediately went to Steve's office and asked for an apology. Learn the grammar structures.

Past Perfect Progressive

Past Perfect Progressive is used to emphasize the duration of an action that was completed before another action or event in the past.



Aya had been taking a nap for longer than an hour when the door opened.

He had been looking for Aya before he went inside the nap pod.



Use	The first past action finished before the second past action.			The first past action is continued until the second past action.		
Time Markers	by the time, when, before			by the time, when, before		
Examples	They had worked on the project by the time they went home. He had looked for Aya before he went inside the nap pod.		They had been working on the project for six hours by the time they went home. He had been looking for Aya before he went inside the nap pod.			






