

Used to talk about an action that will continue at a certain time in the future.

He will have been teaching at university for three years by the time he leaves our town.

They will have been waiting for me for a long time by the time my plane lands.

They will have been working on the website for two weeks when we have our next big meeting with some partners.

Usage	The first future action will finish before the second future action.			To describe an action that will continue until a particular event or time in the future.

Example	She will have completed the project by the time I call her.			She will have been sleeping for seven hours by the time her alarm clock goes off.


