



Intensifiers and Mitigators

Adverbs that express "intensity"

Intensifiers make expressions stronger.

Our product sales are extremely high this month.

You are an absolutely amazing performer.

He came **incredibly close** to winning the race.

Mitigators make expressions weaker.

Mr. Williams spoke quite frequently.

The temperature was barely above freezing.

I am just slightly doing what is best for the company.

Interjections

- used to express strong feelings or sudden emotions.

Usually followed by an **exclamation mark** (!) and written at the **beginning** of the sentence.

Whew! That's great news. (relief)

Yikes! What have you done? (fear or concern)

Hurrah! I won the prize. (happiness)

Listen! I am starving. (attention)

Yippee! This calls for a celebration! (exclamation of celebration)

Other Common Interjections

Eww! – disgust

Hmm! – thinking

Wow! - surprise

Ahh! – realization

Shh! - silence

Tsk! – disapproval


