Other forms of making a suggestion and a recommendation

I suggest/recommend that

I suggest/recommend that + subject (singular/plural) + base form of the verb.

- I suggest that they study grammar more.
- I recommend that she focus on improving her listening.
- I suggest he learn more vocabularies.

I suggest/recommend + gerund

I suggest/recommend + (-ing) form

- She recommends trying the Italian restaurant nearby.
- I suggest going to Hawaii in summer.
- We recommend checking into the hotel early.


