Subjunctive Mood

Used to talk about recommendations, suggestions, advice, requests, and demands.

Recommend/demand that + subject + (should) verb

He insisted that I (should) go with them.

He ordered that it (should) be sent back.

It is + adjective +that

It is important that you always do your best.

- It is necessary that they call the hotel first.
- It is necessary they call the hotel first.

Note:

- ✓ In British English, the modal should is used to express the mandative subjunctive.
- ✓ It is usually acceptable to omit the word that in both spoken and written English.

Subjunctive Mood

How to express the subjunctive mood:

- The first verb is indicative which can use any tenses.
 - e.g. He is insisting that she follow the recipe.

 They recommended that I bring a coat.
- Use the base form of any verb in the clause.
 - e.g. I recommend that you see the movie.

 It is best that he try surfing.
- The verb to look different in both moods.
 It's important that I am here early. (indicative)
 They suggest that I be here early. (subjunctive)
