Used to say it is time to do something that should have been done a long time ago.

It's (high) time + subject + past simple

It's high time we went on a holiday.

It's (high) time + subject + were

It's high time he were in bed. It's late.

What is something you should have done a long time ago?

- It's high time the company changed the policy.
- It's high time the President made some sound decisions.

2 Give advice or suggestions

- It's high time you stopped smoking.
- It's high time we organized team building.

It's (high) time + to

It's time to revise our marketing strategies.

It's (high) time + for + to

It's time for him to meet our department heads.

- It's time to go to bed. It's almost midnight.
- It's time to leave. She's taking so much time.

2 It's time + for + noun/pronoun

- It's time for you to buy a new pair of jeans.
- It's time for her to ask for a raise.

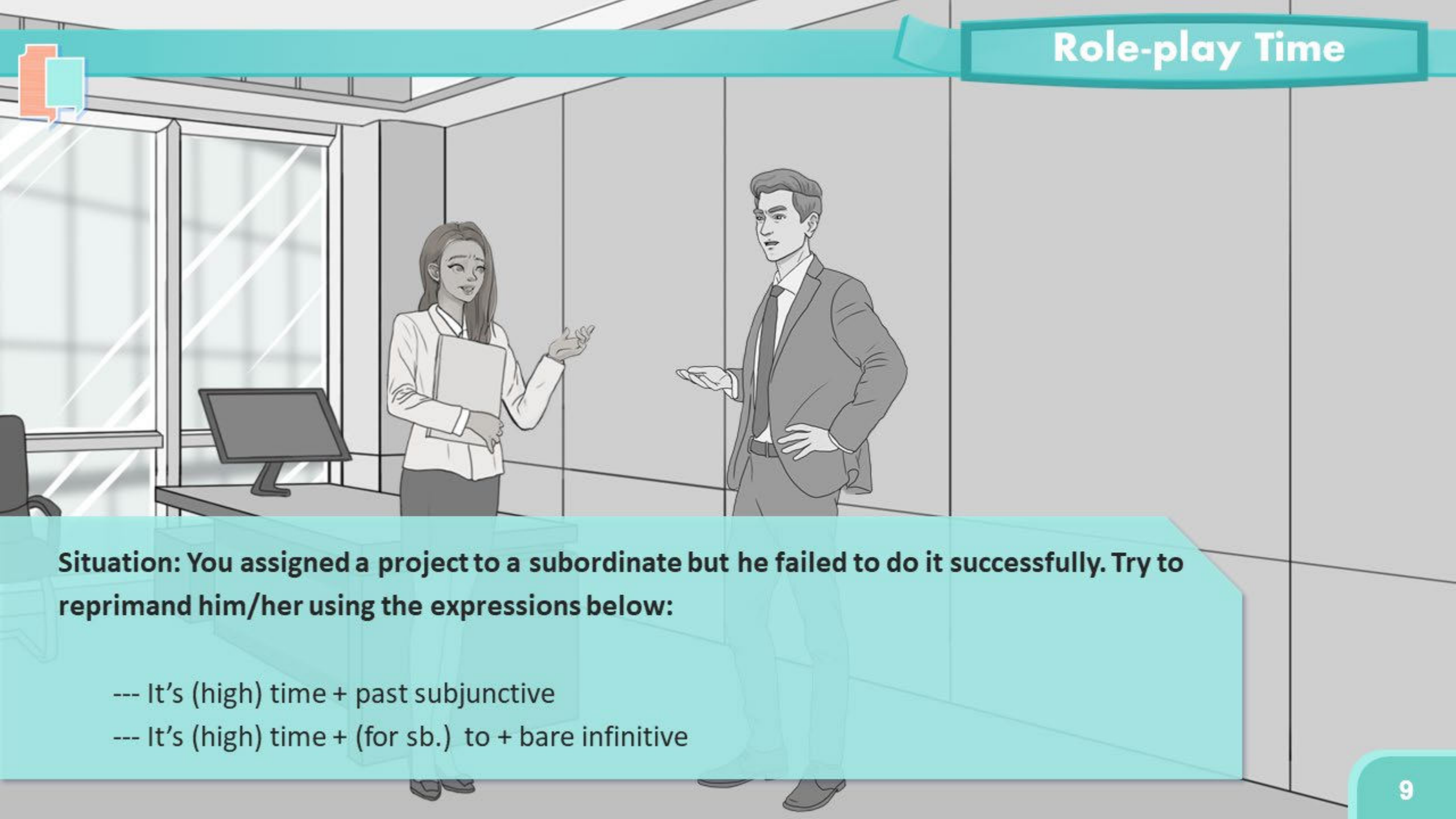
