Parallelism

means that similar parts of a sentence have the same structure

Parallel structures should be used:



- when **elements** are joined by a **coordinating conjunction**
- when comparing and contrasting

Examples:

- This partnership is <u>favorable</u>, <u>rewarding</u>, and <u>will benefit us.</u>

 adjective adjective future simple verb
- ✓ This partnership is favorable, rewarding, and beneficial.

adjective adjective adjective

- X I am allergic to the dog's hair and how it smells.
- ✓ I am allergic to the dog's hair and smell.
- X James enjoyed <u>reading</u> more than <u>to write</u>.

 gerund to-infinitive
- ✓ James enjoys <u>reading</u> more than <u>writing</u>.
