Olivia: Are you considering working in one of these two countries?

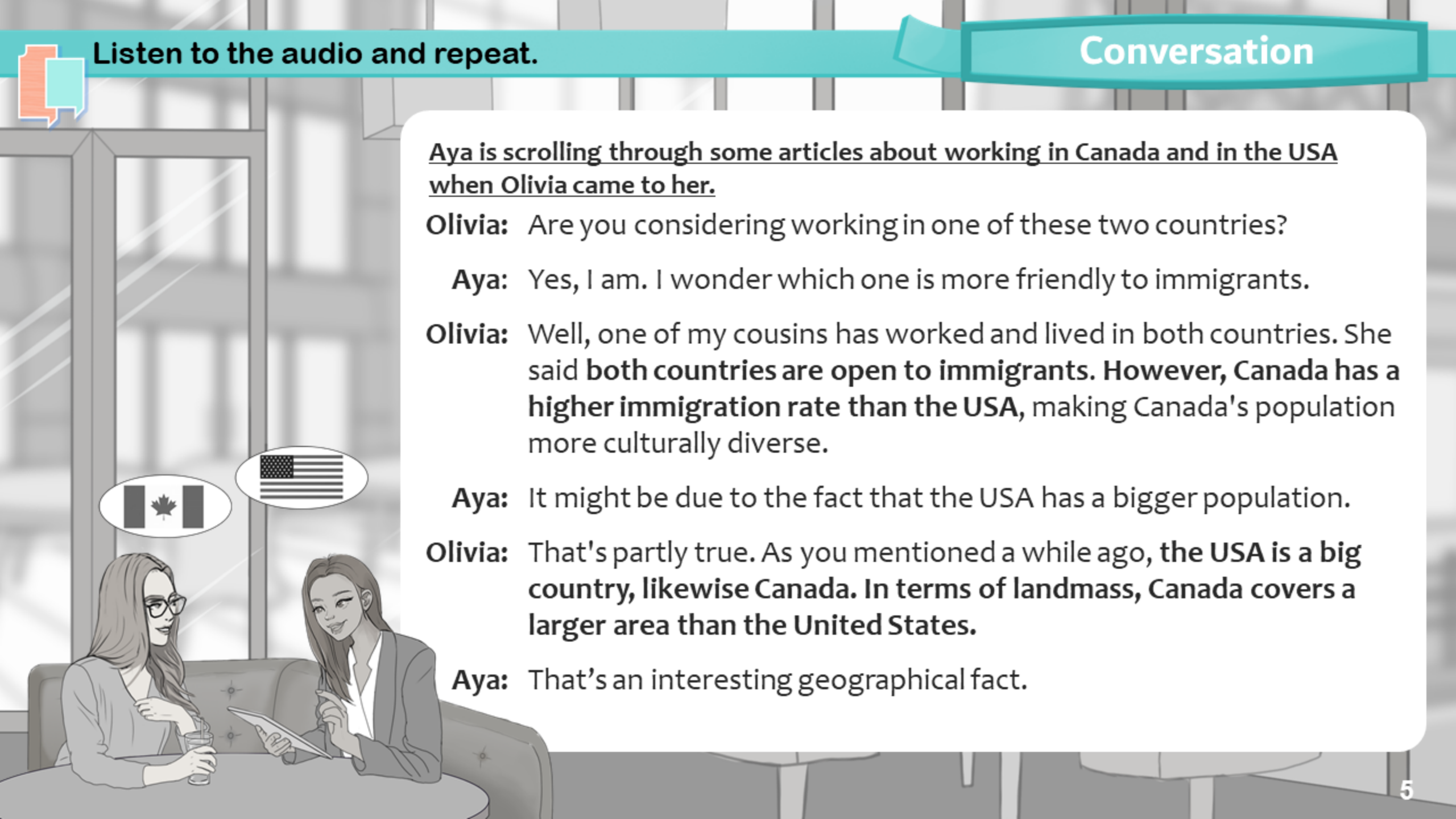
Aya: Yes, I am. I wonder which one is more friendly to immigrants.

■ **similarly**

Buses must stop at red traffic lights:
similarly bikes have to stop, too.

■ **comparable to**

The quality of our products is
comparable to branded items.

■ **the same as**

Her dress is *the same as* the dress Jane
wore on her birthday party.

■ **whereas/ while**

My sister enjoys the beach, *whereas* I
enjoy the quiet mountain view.

■ **despite/ in spite of**

He still won the championship *despite*
his injuries.

■ **although/ though**

Although she loves teaching, she
decided to be a nurse.
