

Emoticons

Nowadays, young people use lots of emojis in text messages, but many adults grew up using emoticons. Both of them can express emotions but they are not the same thing.

Emoticons are made of punctuation marks, letters and numbers that represent a facial expression. For example: :) :(:O

facial expression

the look on a person's face that tells his feelings

express

 to show or tell ones' emotion

represent

to be a symbol of something



Read and learn.

Emoticons are older than emojis. The emoticons we use today were created in the 1980s. They became popular in the 1990s.

Emoticons are more limited than emojis. An *emoji* is a tiny picture of faces, objects and symbols. Actually it can be anything. An emoticon is only a facial expression that expresses an emotion. Also, most emoticons need to be read sideways.



limited – small in amount or number



sideways – facing side to side; either left or right

:)	a smile (the most well-known emoticon)
;)	a wink
:D	a laugh
-,-	sad or annoyed
:0	surprised
^.^	smiling face with smiling eyes
Orz	sadness, failure(a posture emoticon)


