## The Myth of Cake and Candles

Every year, we celebrate our birthday with cakes and candles. We light the candles, make a wish and then blow out the candles.

The ancient Greeks believed that the smoke from the candles carried their wishes and prayers to gods. Others believed the smoke helped to protect them from evil spirits.

#### Read and learn.

Modern people think differently but they hope the tradition can bring the birthday person good luck. Many people believe that the birthday person must make a silent wish before blowing out the candles. The person cannot tell anyone else the wish, or it will not come true.





#### Read and learn.

If the person blows out all the candles in one breath, the wish will come true. And the person will have good luck throughout the year.

The birthday cake has also become a symbol of love. Everyone can get a slice. People gather together to celebrate and to have a good time. Again, the birthday person needs to cut the first slice for good luck.
