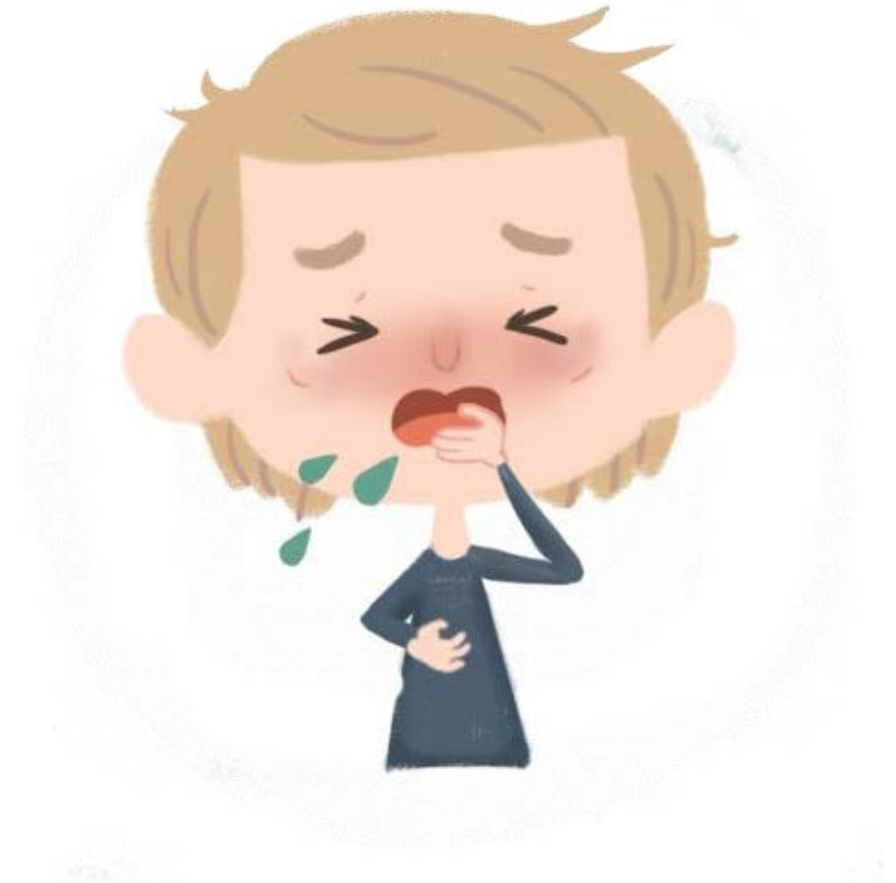

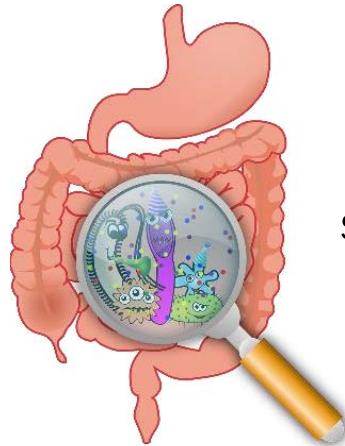
Ahchoo!

We sneeze because our nose needs cleaning. Sneezing is cleaning our nose so we can keep breathing clean air.

A sneeze can send 100,000 **germs** into the air. So it's important to sneeze with a piece of tissue or our **elbow**. Yes, use your elbow rather than your hands. The germs could pass through our fingers. We could also spread germs as we touch things later.

Read and learn.

We all make some noise when we sneeze. Some people are loud sneezers, others are soft. When we sneeze, air moves out of our nose and mouth as fast as 100 miles an hour. That's the speed of a racing car! The faster the air moves, the louder the sneeze is.

We may feel as if our heart stops when we sneeze, but it doesn't. In fact, the rhythm of our **heartbeat** changes when we sneeze.

heartbeat

-- a single pump of the heart



Read and learn.

In some Asian countries, when you sneeze, it means someone is talking about you behind your back.

In the West, people say "God bless you" when a person sneezes. There was a belief that when people sneezed, their **soul** got out of their body.

Trying to hold in a sneeze can **hurt** your eyes and ears. So never **control** it.

soul

hurt– to cause pain, harm or suffering



control -- to stop something from happening

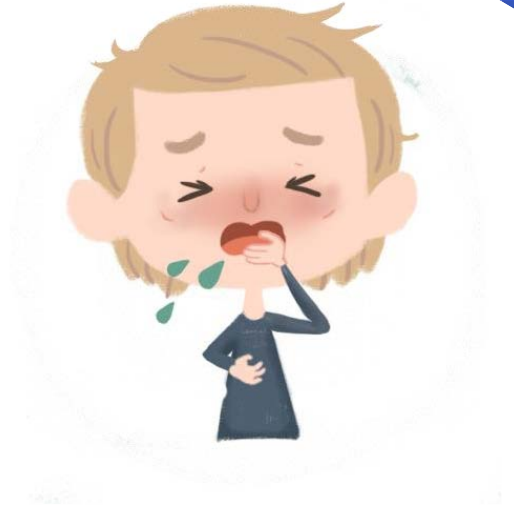
