- Is that the restroom? No, it isn't.

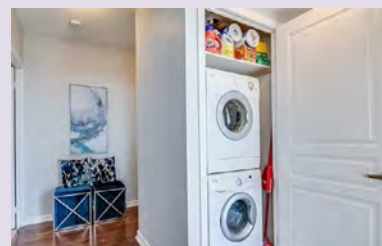
