

- Great job! / Well done!
- It's absolutely / quite impressive.

- > Keep up the good work!
- > You must be proud of yourself.

Example sentences:

- You did a great job in today's presentation!
- Your output was absolutely impressive.
- Well done, Kazuki! Your report was quite impressive.

- I appreciate your kind words.
- ➤ I will strive to do my best.

Example sentences:

- Thank you! I really appreciate your kind words.
- Thank you for appreciating my hard work.
- I will work hard to finish my task.

You can also use:

- thankful for + purpose
- e.g. I'm thankful for your guidance over the years.
- Couldn't have done it without + people
- e.g. I couldn't have done it without your team.
