Steps to follow when you are looking for further explanation.

- 1. Admit you need clarification.
- 2. Ask for repetition.
- 3. Ask for specific examples.

... Asking Someone for Something Politely

- ➤ May I have ...?
- > Could I have ...?

Example sentences:

- May I have some sample pictures of business casual clothing?
- Could I have a copy of the monthly report?

You can also use:

- Would you mind...?
 e.g. Would you mind showing me any sample items?
- Would it be possible...?
 e.g. Would it be possible to ask for more examples?
