- > Respond to the bad news.





e.g. Employees should be trained first before they start working.

- Could you please let me know your thoughts on this?
- Could you share your opinions on this idea?
- Could you please let me hear your idea?

Other related expressions:

- What do you suggest?
- What is your advice?
- What would you do in this situation?

- I think you should + verb.

e.g.

Let's solve the problem now.

I think you should check
the profits first before
deciding.


