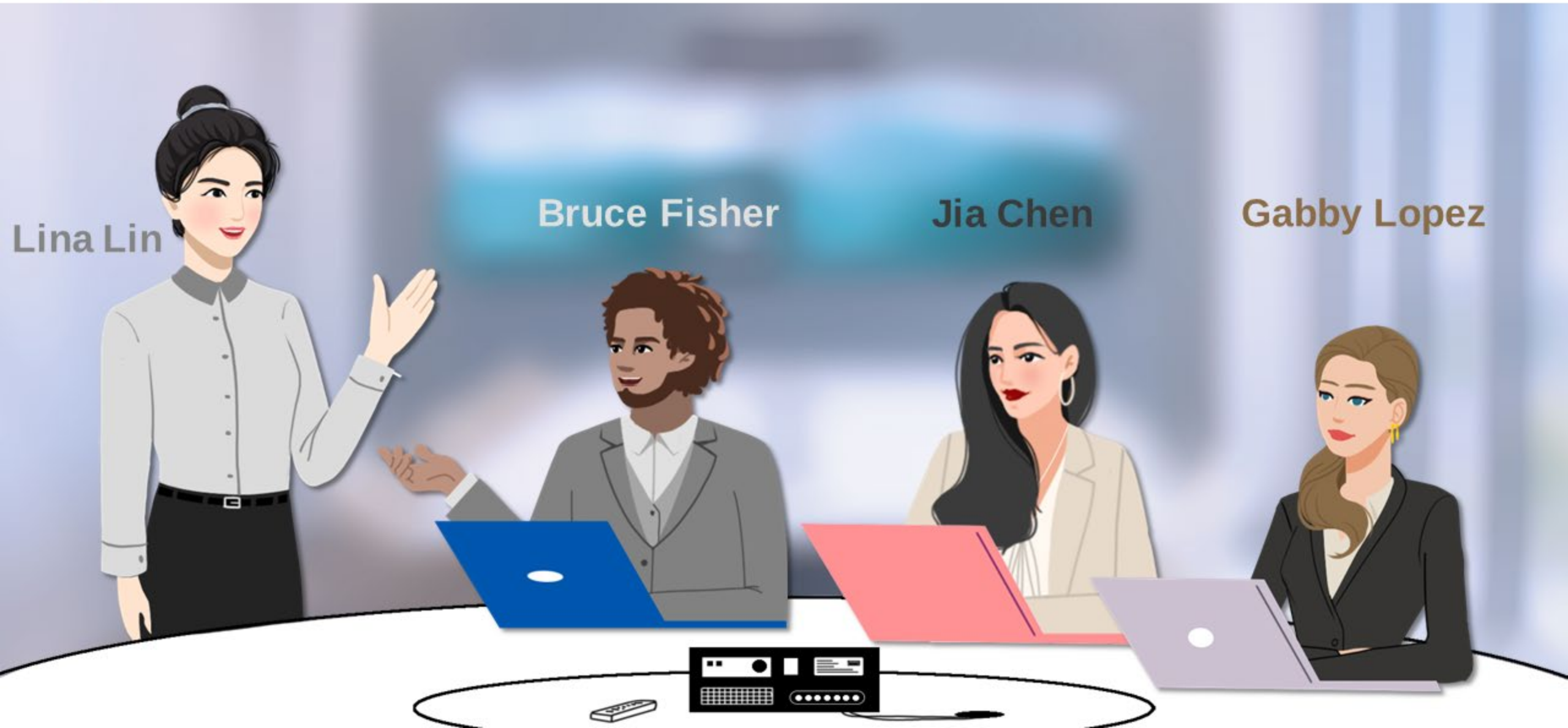

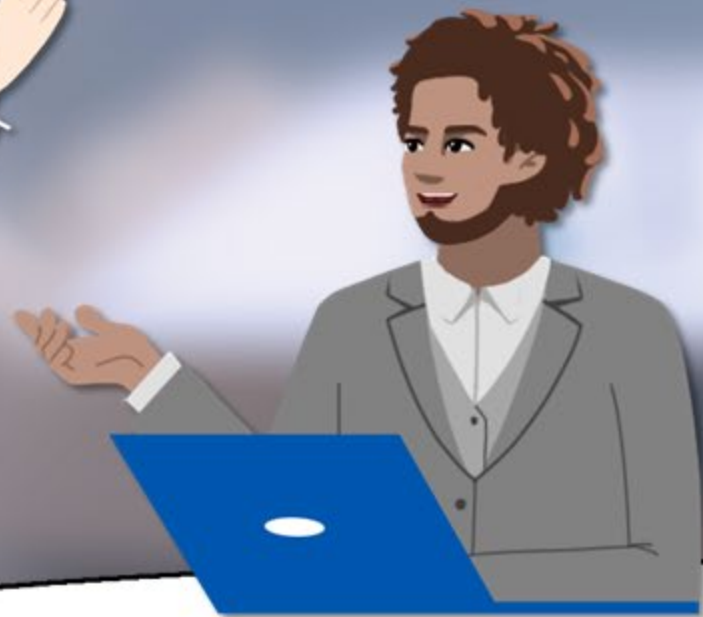

⋮ How to Hook an Audience

Technique 1



"The average adult attention span is less than a goldfish."

Give short stories that are connected to your topic.

The ancient Greek writer Aesop told a fable about a boy who put his hand into a pitcher of nuts. The boy grabbed as many of the delicious nuts as he possibly could. But when he tried to pull them out, his hand wouldn't fit through the neck of the pitcher because he was grasping so many of them. Instead of dropping some of them so that his hand would fit, he burst into tears and cried about his predicament. The moral of the story is **"Don't try to do too much at once"** (Aesop, 1881).
