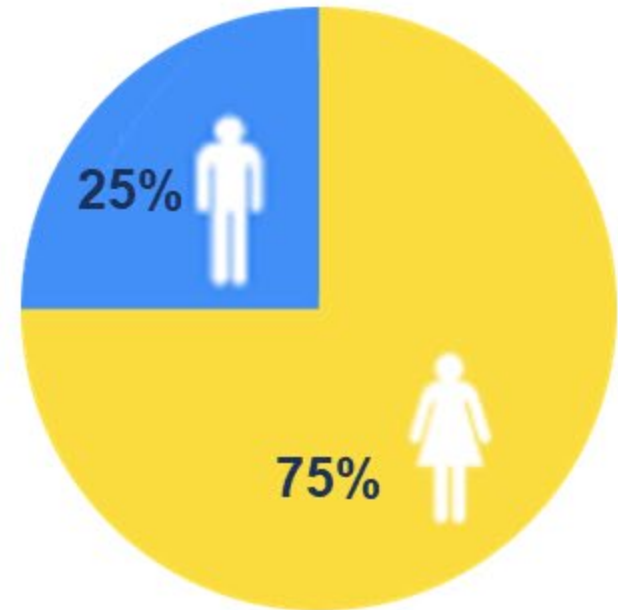
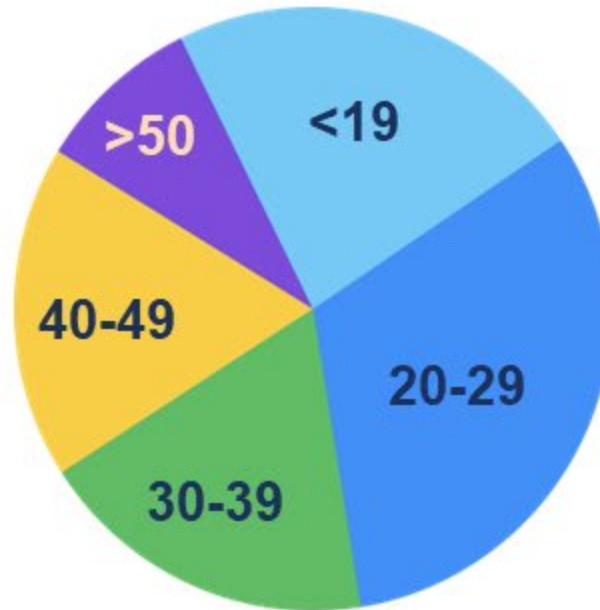




Chart 1 breaks down the users by age.

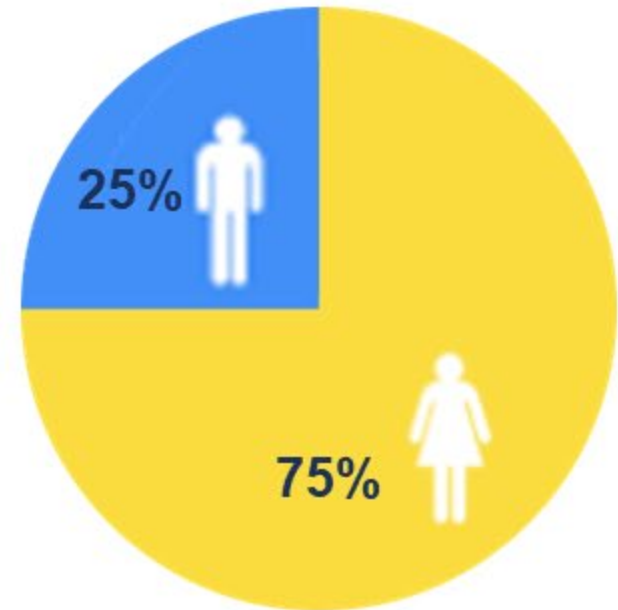
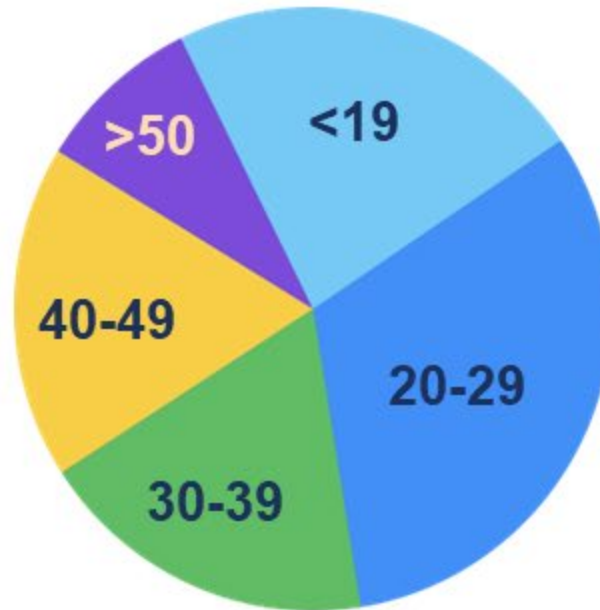
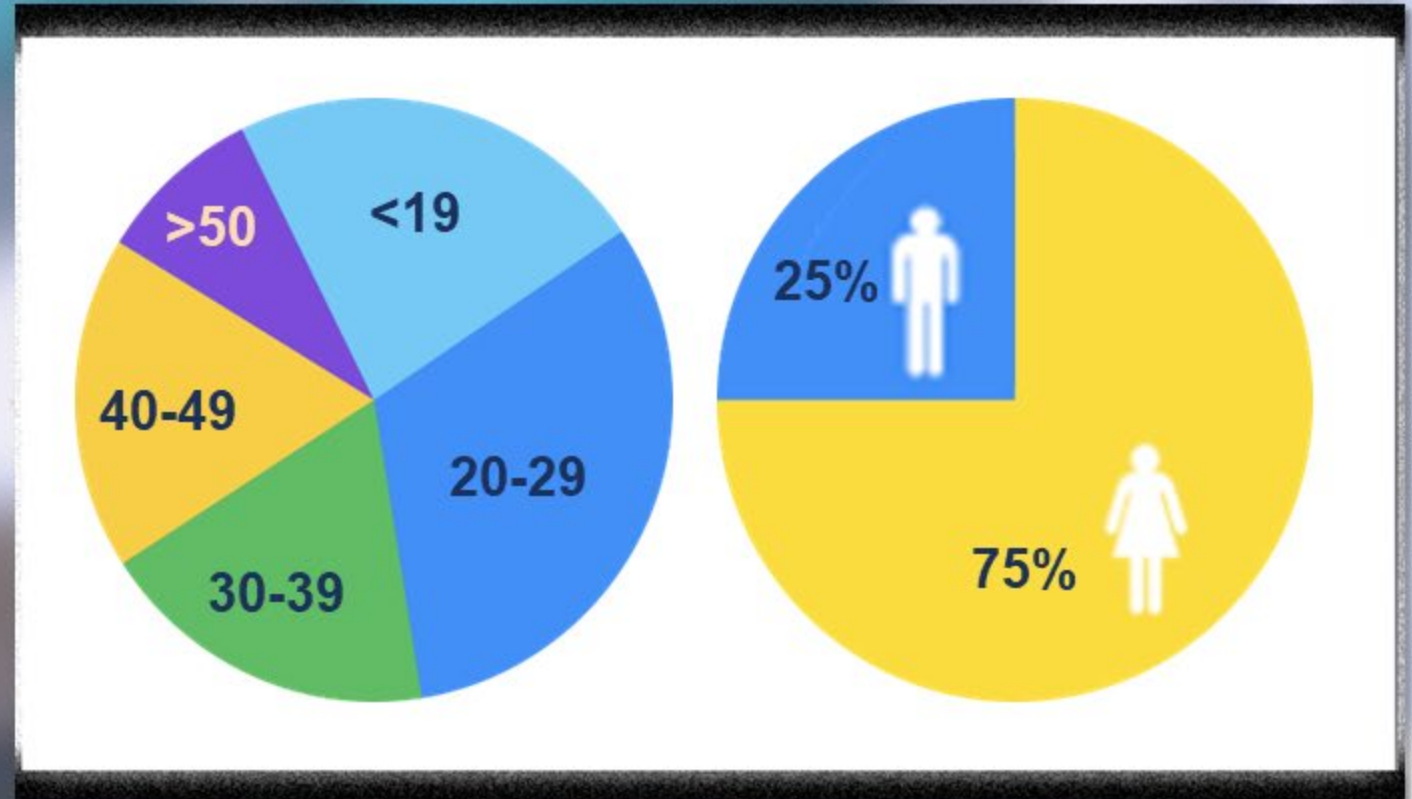




Chart 2 shows gender differences.

(phr.v.) to separate something into smaller parts

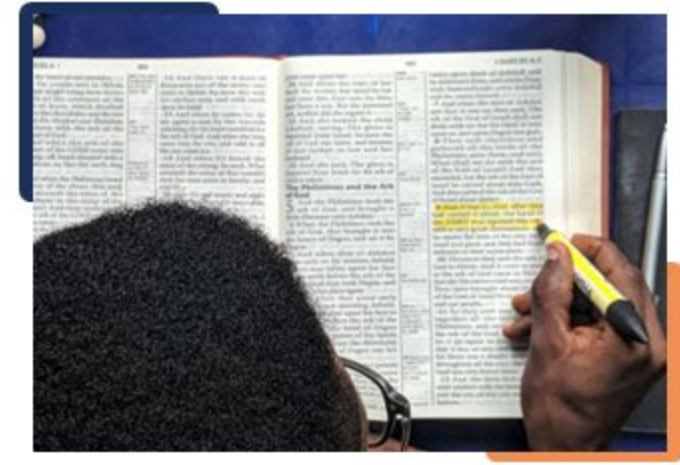
e.g. The report **breaks down** the results region by region.

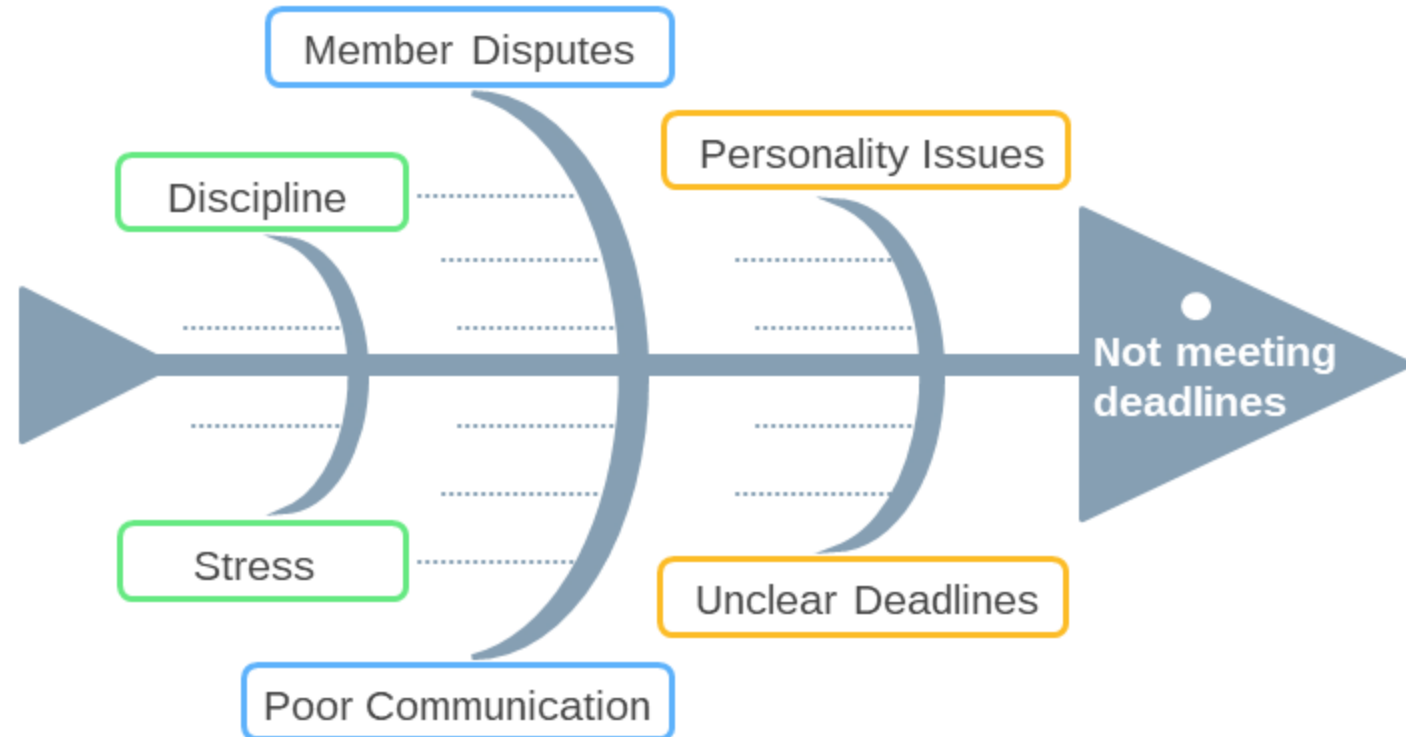
