

- In short, hiring more employees is our next target.
- On the whole, we should improve our customer service.

2. Conclude the second point

Besides, ... What's more, ... In addition, ... More importantly, ...

Example sentences:

- Besides, improving employees' skills must be the top priority.
- In addition, facilities and equipment should be sufficient.
