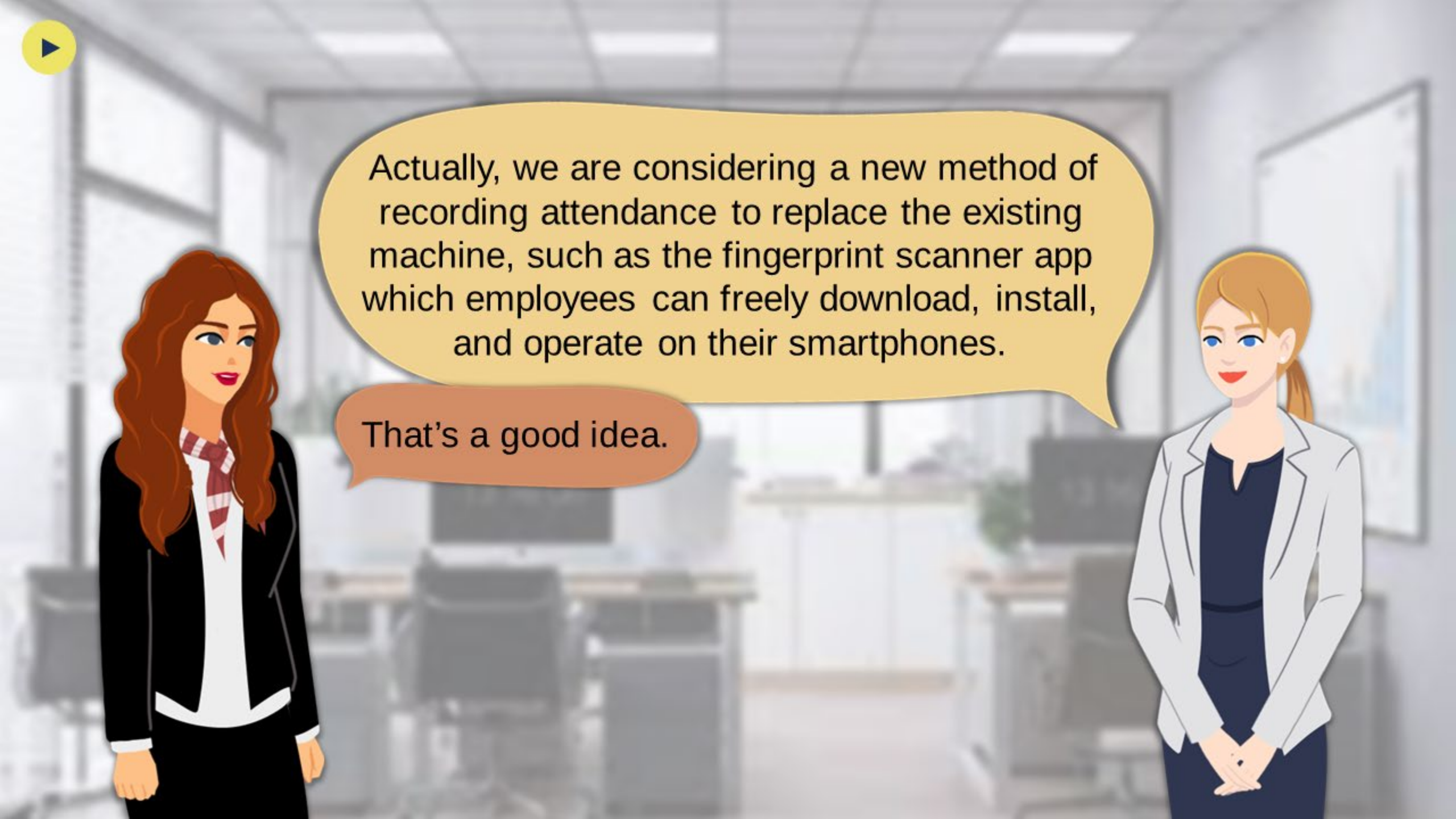

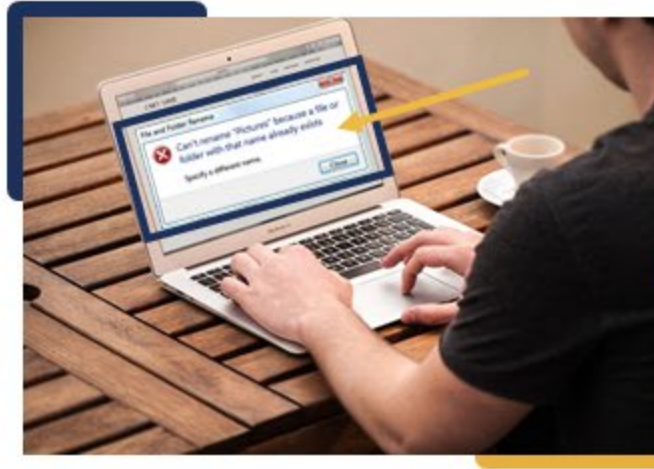

- Do you have a moment/ minute?
- **(modal)** I have a word with you?
- **(modal)** I take a little of your time?
- **(modal)** we have a quick chat? *(informal)*
- **(modal)** I borrow/ grab you for a sec? *(informal)*

### How to use modal verbs in different situations:

- **can** - ability/ permission  
ex. Can I borrow your laptop?
- **could** - past ability/ permission  
ex. Could you help me fix the problem?
- **may** - permission  
ex. May I leave early today?
- **might** - probability/ possibility  
ex. Might it rain tonight?

### The Difference Between “Problem” and “Issue”

- **Problem**
  - temporarily or permanently
  - cause other to be affected
  - can be handled openly
- **Issue**
  - cause personal annoyance
  - can be handled privately
  - has a recognizable solution

Example sentences:

- **This problem can be solved by...**

Ex. This problem can be solved by reviewing the whole process.
