




- In the near future, I'd like to build and manage larger teams. (long-term goal)
- In 2 years, I hope to develop an app that would become very popular. (long-term goal)

Short-term Goals

- can be achieved quickly/ in a short time
- help you achieve your long-term goal
- Long-term Goals
- usually take longer to achieve
- may consist of many short-term goals
