Jennifer: Mom, if it rains, I won't water the plants.

Mom: What's the weather like outside?

Jennifer: It is cloudy.

If it rains,

Mom: I don't think it will rain today. Did you clean the windows?

Jennifer: No, not yet. I am going to clean the windows now.
