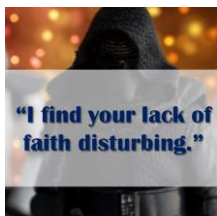

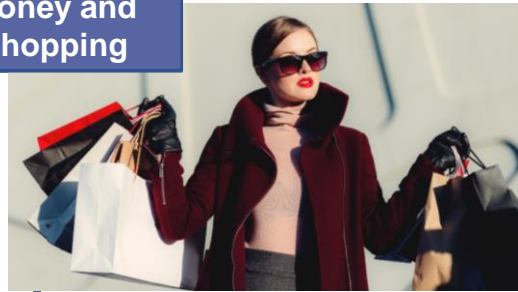
**runs in the blood/family** if a quality, ability, disease, etc. runs in the family, many members of the family have it

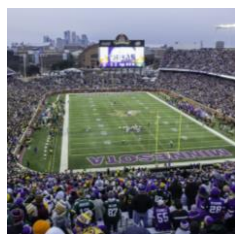

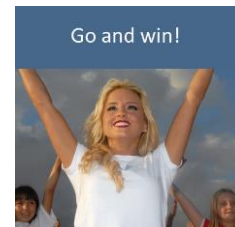

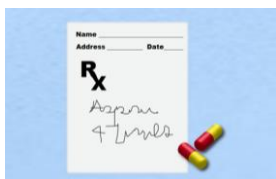
