The **project scope** involves determining and documenting a list of specific project goals, deliverables, tasks, costs, and deadlines. To determine the scope, project managers must collect requirements for what the stakeholders need from the project. This includes the following elements:

- 1 the project's objectives and deliverables
- 2 when the project must be completed
- 3 how much the stakeholders can pay for it

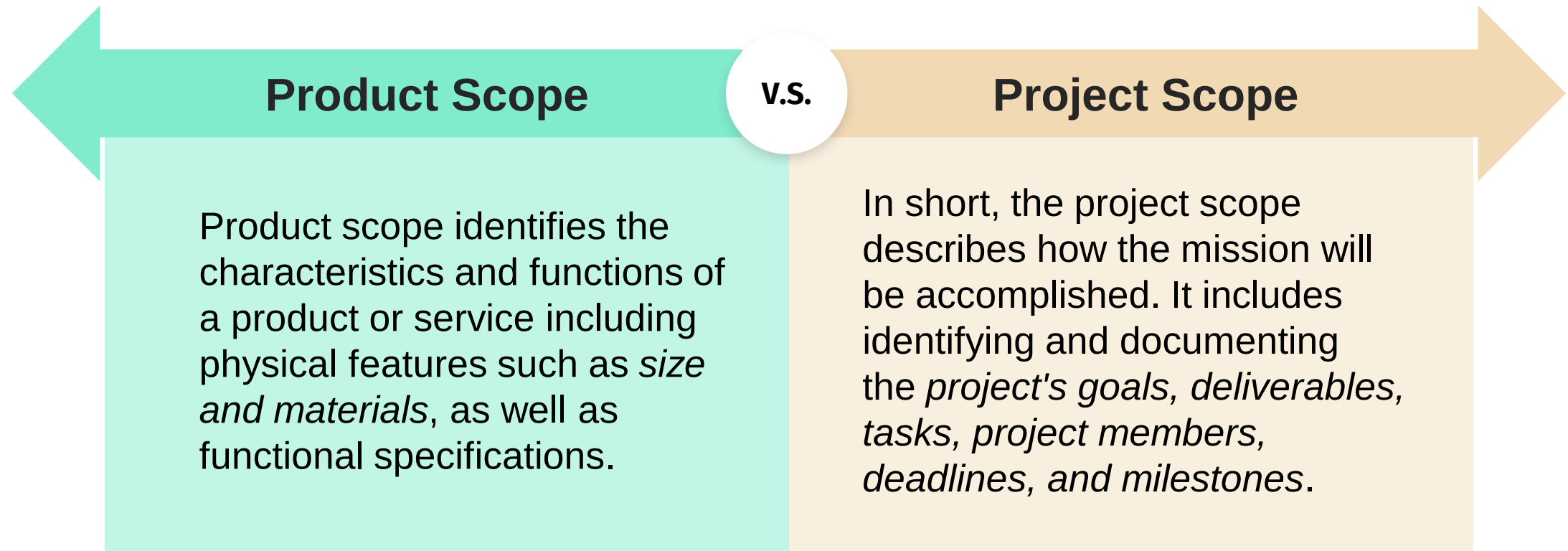
