



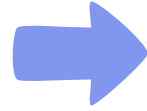

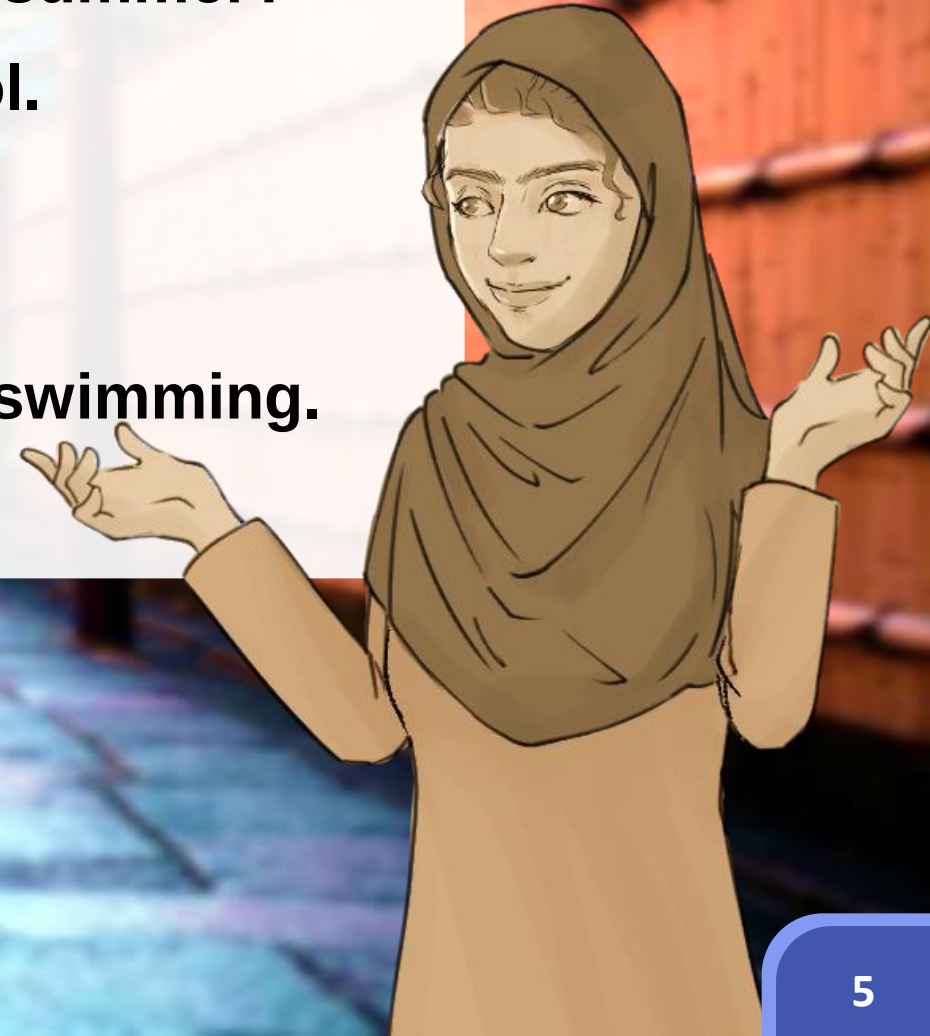

A **gerund** is a noun in the form of a present participle.



Eve **likes swimming**.

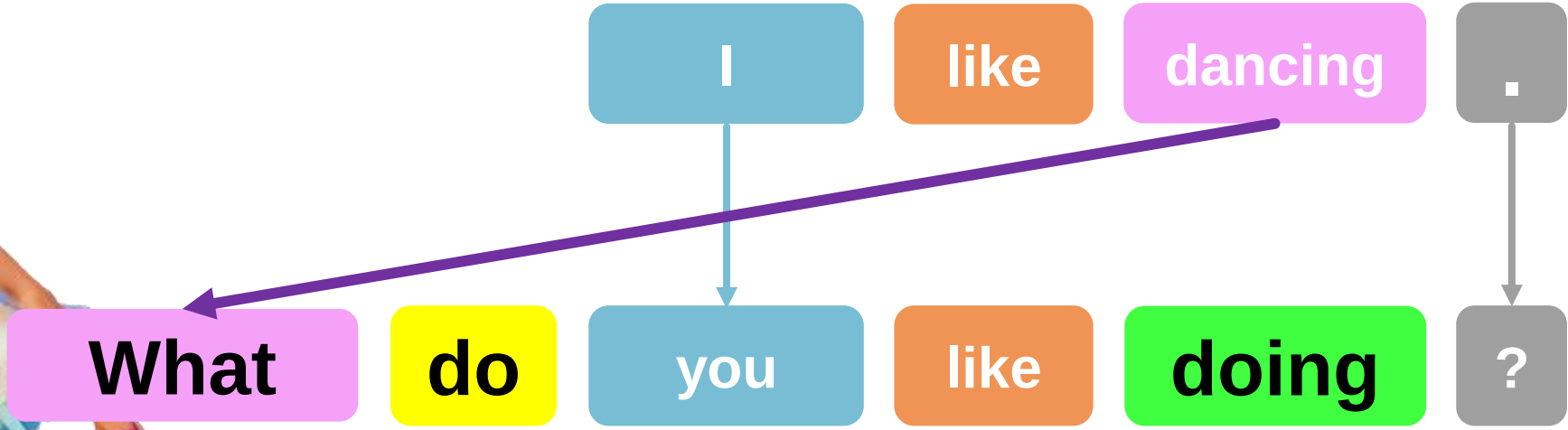


They **like skating**.



We **like hiking**.

It is used to talk about hobbies or fun activities.



They **go skiing**.



We **go camping**.



She **goes surfing**.

It is used when **giving a suggestion.**
