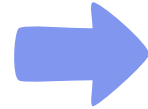

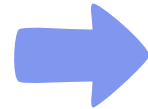

Adjective (adj.)

- describes a noun.

She is **beautiful**.

I am a **careful** person.

My homework is **easy**.

Adverb (adv.)

- usually describes a verb and usually ends in **-ly**, but **not always**.

She sang **beautifully**.

He walked **carefully**.

I can finish my homework **easily**.



Note: Some words can be an adjective and an adverb, e.g. **well**.

I feel **well**. (adj. healthy) You dance **well**. (adv. in a good way)
