Ordinal numbers are ordered; first, second, third, fourth, and so on.



First, second and third are irregular forms.

To make ordinal numbers for other numbers, "-th" is added to the cardinal number:

four > fourth

five > fifth

six > sixth

seven > seventh

and so on.
