












Let's Think

Two Ways to Introduce a Topic:

- 1. Ask a question about the activity.
 Would you like to grow a flower?
- Make a statement about the activity.I can teach you how to grow a flower.

Time-Order Words

- first next
- now

Middle

Time-order words will help you explain step by step.

2. Tell why others might like the activity.
