The three parts of a book review do different jobs:




It introduces the book's name, the author, and what the book is about.



It tells your favorite part of the book.



It is about why you think others should read this book.





Do you like reading detective fiction books?














Generally, we do these two things for prewriting.



Choose a topic







Gather Details about the topic

If you read a book review, what would you want to know from it?






I want to get this information from Owen's book review:


