

Descriptive Paragraph



In descriptive writing, you use words to "paint" or "describe" a picture about something/somebody.

In a descriptive paragraph of a person, the three parts do different jobs:




It tells the who the paragraph is about.



They describe what the person looks like and what she or he does.




It tells how the writer feels about the person.


What did Robin do to gather details?




