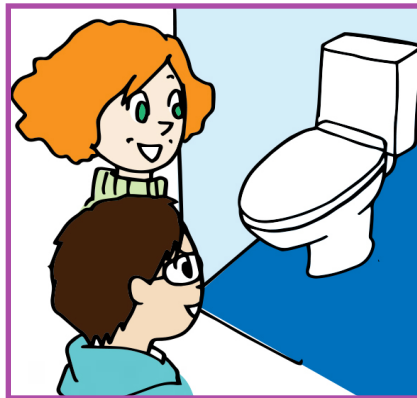


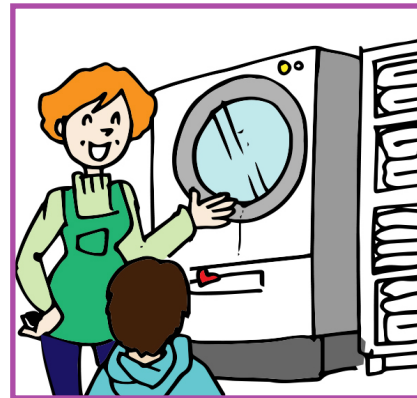

Naoto : I can't wait.

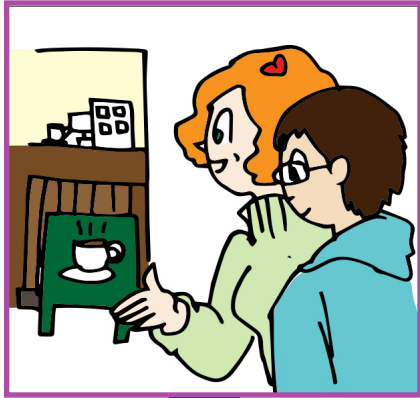

Jennifer : "Terminator" is being shown now.
Naoto : Good! But **the TV is too loud.**
Jennifer : Oh. Is it?
Naoto : Yes. We might disturb your mom and dad.

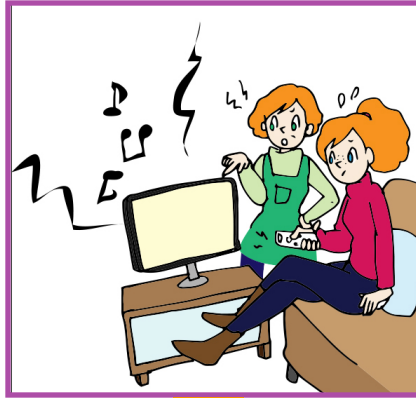

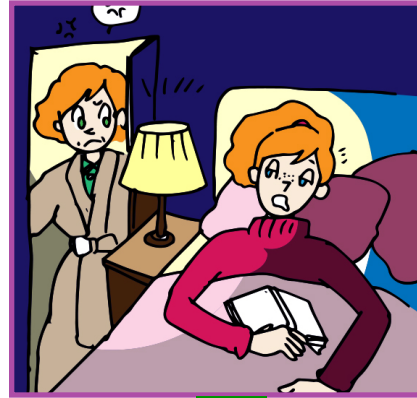

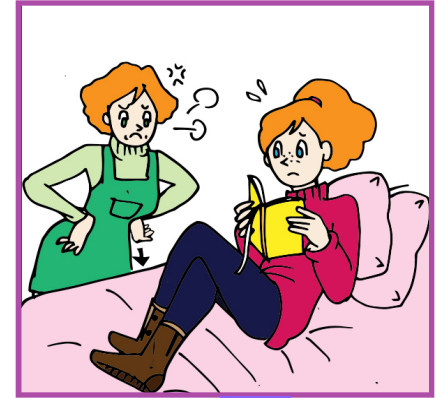

Example

1. Turn down the TV.

Conversation:

Jennifer : This movie is so exciting.
Annie : It's getting late. Go to bed.
Jennifer : In a while, mom.
Annie : **Turn down the TV.** It's too loud.
Jennifer : Oh, I'm sorry.
Annie : Okay. Don't stay up late.

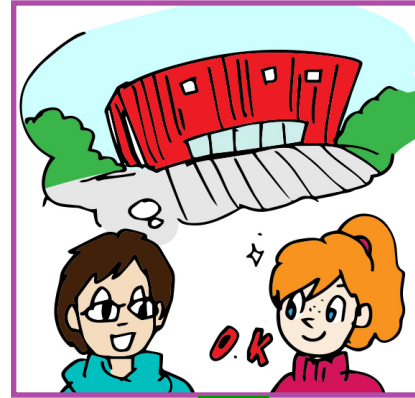
